Recommendations for Council action, pursuant to Resolutions (Harris-Dawson - Bonin), SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

- ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2017-18 State Legislative Program, SUPPORT for and/or SPONSORSHIP of legislation that would amend California Health and Safety Code Section 11357(b)(2) to change the punishment for the possession of more than 28.5 grams of marijuana or 4 grams of concentrated cannabis for personal use to an infraction punishable by community service or a fine of not more than \$100. (Council file [C.F.] No. 17-0002-\$106)
- 2. ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2017-18 State Legislative Program, SUPPORT for and/or SPONSORSHIP of legislation that would amend California Health and Safety Code Section 11357(a)(2) to change the punishment for the possession of less than 28.5 grams of marijuana or less than 4 grams of concentrated cannabis by a person over 18 years of age, but not yet 21 years of age, from a maximum \$100 fine to a requirement to perform not more than 10 hours of community service and a requirement that the person cited for possession participate in a youth and safety program. (C.F. No. 17-0002-S107)

## <u>SUMMARY</u>
