We would like to express our strong support for Resolution #17-0002-S97 in support of Senate Bill 100 introduced by Senator De León which focuses on utilizing renewable energy resources in California.

Liberty Hill Foundation has worked at the forefront of environmental justice issues in the Los Angeles area for over 40 years, providing grants and technical assistance to grassroots organizations working to improve their communities' health, quality of life and access to opportunity. We stand in unison with the strong support expressed by many community-based organizations for Senate Bill 100 which seeks to achieve 100% renewable electricity in California by 2045. We firmly encourage continuation of efforts to promote clean air, equity and climate protections for the health of our communities and our planet.

Senate Bill 100 mentions the necessity to improve California's air quality and public health, particularly in disadvantaged communities, and to ensure electricity rates are just and reasonable. Low-income communities of color are disproportionately impacted by fossil fuels and therefore desperately need the health advantages provided by renewable energy resources. And, it is extremely important that we invest in the equitable distribution of the health, environmental and economic benefits provided by clean and renewable energy systems.

Burning oil, gas and coal is not only polluting our air, water and land, and damaging our health—it is changing our climate even faster than scientists predicted.
