PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the Fiscal Year 2016 (FY16) Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

Recommendation for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

AUTHORIZE the General Manager, Emergency Management Department (EMD), or designee, to:

- a. Accept the FY16 EMPG from the FEMA in the amount of \$644,976 with a grant performance period of July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017.
- b. Execute the subrecipient agreement, included as an attachment to the EMD's transmittal, between the City and the County of Los Angeles, in the amount of \$644,976 for a term of July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017, for the acceptance of the EMPG, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form.
- c. Deposit the EMPG funds received under the subrecipient agreement into the General Fund No. 100/35, Revenue Source Code No. 3702, Emergency Management Assistance.
- d. Prepare Controller instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer (CAO); and, AUTHORIZE the Controller to implement the instructions.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: The CAO reports that there is no additional impact to the General Fund as a result of these actions. Acceptance of the FY16 EMPG in the amount of \$644,976 will provide support for the City's emergency management programs. These recommendations are in compliance with the City's Financial Policies in that grant funds are sufficient to support the grant activities.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At the meeting held on March 21, 2017, your Public Safety Committee considered EMD and CAO reports relative to the EMD's request for authority to accept the FY16 EMPG in the amount of \$644,976 from the Department of Homeland Security for the grant performance period of July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017. The CAO reports that EMD also requests authority to execute a subrecipient agreement with the County of Los Angeles to receive the City's portion of the EMPG. The EMPG requires a dollar for dollar match that the City has met through General Funded emergency management expenses. The purpose of the EMPG is to sustain and improve comprehensive emergency management programs at the state, tribal and local levels from all man-made and natural disasters through the prevention, mitigation, response and recovery of all-hazards events. After an opportunity for public comment was held, the Committee moved to approve the recommendation presented in the CAO transmittal, as detailed above.

This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
