Dear Gentlemen,

The City of Los Angeles, Officials, and some of its employees have a pattern, practice or unlawful policy that includes, but is not limited to, some or all of the below:

1. Conspiring against the rights of U.S. citizens, as well as against consumers and taxpayers;
2. Making misrepresentations, false and misleading statements, and concealing material facts;
3. Obfuscating public records, codes, laws and confusing the audit trail in administrative records;
4. Denying impacted properties and persons their right to notice, public hearings, and evidence;
5. Not complying with the permitting process and other required processes;
6. Causing harm to the environment, including to wildlife, trees, landforms, and coastal resources;
7. Allowing a select group of persons to get an unfair advantage and to unfairly compete

Not only does the administrative record of this project reflect some or all of these issues, but also these issues could have the additional consequence of allowing a sale of the project to an innocent third party who would not have access to all of the facts and public truths. Any such purchaser would be obstructed from making or denied the ability to make a fully informed decision.

The City of Los Angeles is not a private enterprise.

The City, its Officials, and its employees have a duty to tell the truth, to uphold the U.S. Constitution, and to provide equal justice under the law, but this is not being done.
