As a past docent-in-training of LA Zoo, a past visitor of LAZoo (both curtailed for the last 10 years - since I have come to feel that the Zoo, while well intentioned-I hop is not well actioned) I urge you to take immediate action regarding Billy the Elephant, let him go to the sanctuary in Northern California that has offered to take him.

I assume I do not need to detail the distress that Billy has been evidenced going thru in his captivity at the LAZoo — if you want me to, I will send a response e-mail to you delineating that.

Being forced to live on a 1/4 acre area, in solitary conditions, when it is in the elephant nature to wander up to 100 miles a day, and have social connections — for 27 years, is animal abuse from my perspective.

The people who are calling for Billy the elephant to be removed from the zoo are mostly well-meaning. But they are wrong. The vast majority haven't been to the L.A. Zoo. They respond to a social media request to sign a petition to "free" Billy from his "zoo prison" and send him to a sanctuary.

I've worked at both zoos and sanctuaries. They have one thing in common: people who love the animals and are passionate about their welfare. Almost without exception, the people I've worked alongside were tireless in their efforts to care for the creatures entrusted to them.

The main differences: Sanctuaries have lower standards for accreditation and tend to have far fewer resources.

I still have great admiration and respect for my sanctuary colleagues, but most of them, like myself, eventually left the setting because they were heartsick at never being able to do enough.

At the L.A. Zoo, the animals receive fresh produce daily and their diets are determined by professionals trained in the field of animal nutrition, not dictated by what donations were able to be scrounged up that day. The zoo has a full veterinary staff on hand, state-of-the-art diagnostic equipment, and so on.

"Sanctuary" is a word that sounds great to the man on the street, but it just means a place to house animals that is not held to the same standards as a zoo.


