I am a professor of Evolution and Ecology at UC Davis and a specialist in the study of animal behavior. I have long been engaged in conservation research on wild animals. Decisions about the health and welfare of Billy the Elephant and other zoo animals should be made by professionals, not celebrities or politicians, however well-meaning they may be.

Caring for any animals in captivity is complex and not amenable to soundbites and simplistic prescriptions. The LA Zoo has Billy housed in a high-quality facility that is suited for his needs. He is attended by a caring, professional staff. No legitimate welfare concerns have been raised. This is a misguided attempt to prioritize what a handful of people think is best for this animal over what scientific research has shown to be best for the animal.

Zoos are a critical partner in conservation efforts, through educating the public, engaging in research, and preserving the breeding pool of species disappearing from the wild. If you choose the override the zoo's many experts, you will create a ridiculous narrative that Billy was "saved" from the zoo by "heroic" activists. This would undermine the conservation mission of the LA Zoo, and zoos everywhere. How can one argue that any animals should remain in zoos, if the City Council intervenes to release a perfectly healthy animal held in excellent facilities with top-notch care? Saving elephants and other vulnerable species in the wild requires all hands on deck. We cannot afford to have the effectiveness of zoos as a conservation partner weakened.

This action is not in the best interest of Billy the elephant, it is not in the best interest of conservation efforts for this species, and it is not in the best interest of the thousands of children and families that learn from visiting animals in zoos about the wonders of the natural world and our obligation to preserve them.
