Sheltered


"An individual/family living in a supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designed to provide temporary living arrangement."





Total Homeless Population City of Los Angeles, 2016 - 2017 City of LA Population: Total









Total Housing Placements, Los Angeles Continuum of Care, 2014 - 2016


















Total People in Families Experiencing Homelessness City of Los Angeles, 2016 - 2017







Lifetime Experience with Domestic Violence/Intimate Partner Violence

Domestic Violence/Intimate Partner Violence (DV/IPV) includes lifetime experience of:

- Physical abuse by parent/guardian/other relative or intimate partner
- Sexual abuse by parent/guardian/other relative or intimate partner
- Dating violence
- Stalking



Lifetime Experience with Domestic Violence/Intimate Partner Violence, 18+ City of Los Angeles, 2016 - 2017




