

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to updating the traffic plan for Dodger Stadium on game days.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Cedillo - Wesson):

INSTRUCT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) to develop an updated traffic plan for Dodger Stadium that: reflects the increasing use of technology applications, such as Waze and Google; updated traffic volume counts at each Stadium entry point; and the implementation of road closures, with appropriate personnel, two-hours prior to each home game, at the following locations to provide access to residents only:

- a. Lilac Place at Douglas Street
- b. Innes Avenue at Sunset Place
- c. Everett Street at Sunset Place
- d. Savoy Street at North Broadway
- e. Solano Avenue at North Broadway
- f. Casanova Street at North Broadway
- g. Amador Street at Jarvis Street
- h. Bouett Street at Solano Avenue
- i. North Boylston Street at Academy Road and Scott Avenue
- j. Jarvis Street at Academy Road from 110 Freeway

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

On August 9, 2017, your Committee considered a Motion (Cedillo - Wesson) relative to updating the traffic plan for Dodger Stadium on game days. According to the Motion, the LADOT currently has a traffic plan to address impacts around Dodger Stadium during game days. Various complaints continue to be received from nearby residents due to the increase of traffic flow within residential streets, particularly during sold-out games, opening day, division championships, and world series games. These traffic problems are exacerbated by the increasing use of mobile applications, such as Waze and Google, that guide drivers away from the main roadways and onto the surrounding narrow residential streets. The development of an updated traffic plan is necessary to address the increasing traffic impacts around Dodger

Stadium.

After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to recommend approval of the Motion as detailed in the above recommendation. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
