Dear City Council,

Del Rey is a community with a large number of multi family and commercial properties whose stakeholders have been adversely impacted by last year's RecycLA rollout. The Board and Land Use Committees have heard over time complaints about the quality of service and price increases affected by the program and its local operator, Athens.

While the Board sees the good in the program, the implementation and communication has been lacking. Many in our community were not notified of the changeover, and were told by Athens representatives the prices were non negotiable. While conditions have improved, and the system provides for unseen good in terms of the overall system, it can still be improved for our stakeholders.

Therefore, the Del Rey Neighborhood Council, at its meeting on March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2018, considered the subject, and by a vote of 8-0-1 (Dellinger abstaining) took the following position:
