At its meeting on August 31, 2017, the Homeless Strategy Committee (HSC) considered a report from the City Homeless Coordinator with recommendations relative to a City Application to the Los Angeles County Request for Proposals for City Planning Grants to Prevent and Combat Homelessness. The HSC approved the recommendations with the following amendment:

Replace Recommendation 2a with the following:

- a. AUTHORIZE the City Administrative Officer to, subject to review by the City Attorney as to form and legality:
  - i. Negotiate and execute a grant award agreement for a City Planning Grant to Prevent and Combat Homelessness in an amount of up to \$70,000 with the County of Los Angeles and any other necessary documents relative to the grant award;
  - ii. In order to identify a consultant to review the City Comprehensive Homeless Strategy and prepare recommendations as described in this report, (a) issue a request for bids to an approved pre-qualified list of planning and research firms, to be determined, or alternate procurement method; or (b) if the City Administrative Officer determines that use of competitive bidding would be undesirable, impractical or impossible given the limited time available to complete scope of the work by the County deadline, to procure such consulting services on a sole source basis subject to the contracting limitations in (iii) below; and
  - iii. Negotiate and execute a contract with the identified consultant in the amount up to \$70,000 for a term of five (5) months with an optional three (3) month extension with a scope of work described in this report; and
  - iv. Prepare Controller's Instructions and/or make any technical adjustments that may be required, and authorize the Controller to implement these instructions.

The HSC recommendations are hereby transmitted to the Homelessness and Poverty Committee for consideration.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

That the Homeless Strategy Committee review and process the following recommendations for Council and Mayor consideration:

- 1. AUTHORIZE the City Administrative Officer to:
  - a. Submit an application to the United Way of Greater Los Angeles Home for Good Funders Collaborative in response to the Los Angeles County Request for Proposals for City Planning Grants to Prevent and Combat Homelessness as described in this report; and
- 2. Subject to notification of award:
  - a. AUTHORIZE the City Administrative Officer to, subject to review by the City Attorney as to form and legality:
    - i. Negotiate and execute a grant award agreement with the County of Los Angeles and any other necessary documents relative to the grant award;
    - ii. Issue a request for bids to an approved pre-qualified list of planning and research firms, to be determined, to identify a consultant to review the City Comprehensive Homeless Strategy and prepare recommendations as described in this report:
    - iii. Negotiate and execute a contract with a consultant identified pursuant to the request for bids; and
    - iv. Prepare Controller's Instructions and/or make any technical adjustments that may be required, and authorize the Controller to implement these instructions.
  - b. AUTHORIZE the Controller, to establish a grant receivable in the amount of \$70,000 and establish an appropriation account entitled "Homelessness Planning Grant" within Fund 100 Account 3040 Department 10 for receipt and disbursement of grant funds.

#### SUMMARY

This report provides background and recommendations relative to a City application to the Los Angeles County Request for Proposals for City Planning Grants to Prevent and Combat Homelessness.

#### BACKGROUND

County Request for Proposals for City Planning Grants

On July 28, 2017, the United Way of Greater Los Angeles (UWGLA) Home for Good Funders Collaborative released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for City Planning Grants to Prevent and Combat Homelessness in Los Angeles County (Attached). UWGLA is administering this RFP in partnership with the Los Angeles County Homeless Initiative to allocate funding approved by the County Board of Supervisors for this purpose. Cities in the Los Angeles Continuum of Care are eligible to apply for up to \$70,000 to create a new homelessness plan or enhance/expand an existing homelessness plan. Maximum funding requests are based on the number of persons experiencing homelessness in eligible cities based on the 2017 Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count. The City of Los Angeles is eligible to apply for the maximum request of \$70,000.

As described in the RFP and supporting documents, applications must describe:

- Goals and purpose for undertaking the proposed planning process;
- Process for developing the homelessness plan or expanding/enhancing a current plan:
- Use of funds, if awarded;
- Assets or partnerships that will be leveraged during the planning process; and
- Internal and external stakeholders that will be engaged in the planning process.

In addition, the list of key issues to be addressed in plans resulting from grants awarded includes:

- Actions the City plans to take;
- County Homeless Initiative Strategies with which the City intends to align efforts;
- City resources that will be used to implement the plan;
- · City staff who will lead and participate in plan implantation; and
- City participation in collaborative structures within the City and/or with other cities or in Service Planning Areas.

Applications are due on September 18, 2017. According to the RFP, awards are expected to be announced by October 31, 2017, and contracts will be executed in November 2017. The County has set a goal for cities to complete plans funded by these grants by March 2018, with potential three-month extensions.

#### Proposed City Application

Circumstances have changed drastically since the City's Comprehensive Homeless Strategy (CHS) was adopted in February 2016. The City's homeless count has increased by 20 percent

and voters have approved new funding sources for permanent supportive housing and for homeless services – Proposition HHH and Measure H, respectively.

The City, with Proposition HHH funding, will support the development of permanent supportive housing that represents the long-term solution for most homeless individuals and families. A large portion of the services that address the immediate needs of persons experiencing homelessness, which were supported with one-time City funds in Fiscal Year 2016-17, are now funded with County Measure H revenue. A number of key City CHS strategies are not included in the County homeless strategy and are therefore not eligible for Measure H funding. These include storage, safe parking and outreach coordinated with Los Angeles Police Department Homeless Outreach Partnership Endeavor (HOPE) teams.

This County RFP provides the City with an opportunity to assess, review and update the CHS to align with these changing circumstances. As such, I recommend that the CAO be authorized to submit an application to the United Way of Greater Los Angeles Home for Good Funders Collaborative in response to the Los Angeles County Request for Proposals for City Planning Grants to Prevent and Combat Homelessness. This application will request \$70,000 for consultant services to:

- 1. Review the 62 active strategies of the City Comprehensive Homeless Strategy;
- 2. Recommend amendments to the CHS to ensure effectiveness in response to:
  - a. 20 percent increase in persons experiencing homelessness in the City of Los Angeles based on the 2017 Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count;
  - b. City efforts to finance and facilitate the development of permanent supportive housing, including, but not limited to Proposition HHH implementation; and
  - c. Alignment of City efforts with homeless services funded through Los Angeles County Measure H.

As the City's Homeless Coordinator, I will manage this project, with monthly oversight from the Homeless Strategy Committee. Recommendations resulting from this review will be transmitted to the HSC to review and forward to Council and the Mayor for approval.

In order to complete this project within the timeframe established by the County, we are working with City Departments to identify an existing pre-qualified list of planning and/or research firms that could be used to select a consultant. If funds are awarded, and once a list has been identified, I request that the CAO be authorized to solicit bids to identify a consultant to conduct the work described above.

#### INTRODUCTION

The Home for Good Funders Collaborative is administering this request for proposal process in partnership with the Los Angeles County Homeless Initiative to solicit and make funding recommendations on proposals that will result in a Homelessness Plan for each city which receives a grant.

Cities have played a vital role since the inception of the Los Angeles County Homeless Initiative in 2015, including participation in the development of the strategies that aim to prevent and combat homelessness. On June 13, 2017, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors approved Measure H funding recommendations. The Board also allocated \$2,000,000 in one-time funding from the County general fund to support coordination efforts of the Councils of Governments and planning efforts for cities in the Los Angeles Continuum of Care; this Board motion can be viewed here.

To assist cities in the development of their proposals, an outline of the Homelessness Plan, which each city that receives a grant will develop, will be available at the Applicants' Technical Assistance Session on August 10, 2017, and a standardized planning template will be made available in early November.
