MOTION

The Mural Conservancy of Los Angeles (MCLA) is a non-profit agency that restores, preserves, and documents the murals of Los Angeles. MCLA advocates for the rights of artists and public art, working with artists to support the integrity of their work. The agency is committed to preserving the City's art heritage as one of the mural capitals of the world.

MCLA is seeking to lease space in Downtown Los Angeles, which has become a hub for the arts in the City. There is vacant space on the ground level of the City-owned Metro Transit Division facility located at 260 South Main Street that may be suitable. MCLA would use this location for office space, an art gallery, and potentially for other public activities related to the arts. The space may require some improvements in order for MCLA to occupy the space.

I THEREFORE MOVE that City Council instruct the General Services Department, with the assistance of the City Attorney and City Administrative Officer, to negotiate and execute a lease or license agreement with the Mural Conservancy of Los Angeles (MCLA) for use of the vacant space on the ground level of the Metro Transit Division facility located at 260 South Main Street.
