TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the Vision Zero program and Los Angeles Department of Transportation's (LADOT) engagement with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) regarding 2019 Vision Zero Priority Corridors and Intersections under Caltrans jurisdiction.

Recommendation for Council action:

RECEIVE and FILE the LADOT report dated June 5, 2019, relative to the Vision Zero program and the Department's engagement with Caltrans regarding 2019 Vision Zero Priority Corridors and Intersections under Caltrans jurisdiction.

SUMMARY

In the report to Council dated June 5, 2019, LADOT provides a status update of the Vision Zero program and the Department's engagement with Caltrans regarding 2019 Vision Zero Priority Corridors and Intersections under Caltrans jurisdiction. This Vision Zero Initiative's High Injury Network identifies city streets that account for 70 percent of pedestrian deaths and serious in the City of Los Angeles. LADOT has identified 40 Priority Corridors to focus its first round of safety improvements. In December 2018, Council approved 23 additional Priority Corridors and 60 new Priority Intersections. Several of these recently adopted Priority Corridors and Intersections are partially or totally under Caltrans' jurisdiction.

The departments have met to coordinate and plan for the three Priority Corridors and eight Priority Intersections under full or partial Caltrans jurisdiction, and established monthly meetings to share information, discuss solutions, and track progress on agreed upon treatments. Safety improvement include upgrading crosswalks with additional markings, signal timing modifications, and the installation of concrete treatments and other infrastructure. LADOT's report is submitted for informational purposes only.

At its meeting held August 28, 2019, the Transportation Committee recommended that Council receive and file the LADOT report.
