Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Motion (Krekorian - Blumenfield - Rodriguez)

- 1. NOTE and FILE the Information Technology Agency (ITA) report dated September 24, 2018.
- 2. INSTRUCT the Chief Legislative Analyst and City Administrative Officer, in coordination with City Attorney, ITA, Bureau of Street Lighting, Bureau of Engineering, Bureau of Street Services and any other relevant Departments to continue negotiations with wireless telecommunication service providers and report to Council for approval prior to execution of the agreements; and, ensure the agreements presented consider the following:
  - a. Expediting the rollout of 5G to ensure the City has early mover advantage.
  - b. Protecting the Cityscape and reducing negative visual impacts.
  - c. Minimizing the impact to City infrastructure and operations.
  - d. Achieving full cost recovery and measuring outcomes.
  - e. Incorporating the City's policy goals for Digital Inclusion and Smart City Initiatives.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

## **SUMMARY:**

At its regular meeting held on November 13, 2018, the Information, Technology, and General Services Committee considered an ITA report in response to Motion (Krekorian - Blumenfield - Rodriguez) relative to the status of any ongoing negotiations between the City and any wireless telecommunications service providers for use of the City's light poles or other vertical infrastructure, or co-location of wireless telecommunications infrastructure on any other City property.
