The students, teachers and parents of Palms Elementary School oppose the 3568 Motor Avenue apartment building project – it will hurt us.

WHY DO WE OPPOSE THE PROJECT?

On September 1, 2017, the City of Los Angeles determined that the 3568 Motor Ave project will, "create emissions of dusts, fumes, equipment exhaust, and other air contaminants ... PM2.5 and PM10 emissions ... NOx emissions ... ROG emissions."

We are concerned because state and federal courts have held that these toxic emissions can cause reduced lung function and premature death, particularly in children. Also, no consideration was given to persons with disabilities in the project approval process.

WHAT DO WE WANT RBM TO DO?

To start ... we want RBM to freeze the project until a full Environmental Impact Report ("E.I.R.") and Health Risk Analysis ("H.R.A.") is done for the protection of Palms Elementary School students, teachers and staff. Based upon the reports, it will then be possible to determine what should be done next.

RBM and Hiro Kobayashi were not required to do complete safety reports because they <u>did not</u> disclose to the City that a <u>dry cleaners</u> was previously located at the project site — even though that question was part of the permit application. We believe RBM should be made to follow the rules.

HAS THE BUILDER (RBM) EVER MET WITH PARENTS AND TEACHERS TO DISCUSS THE PROJECT?

NO. RBM has never met with parents and teachers to discuss the project. In fact, we were told nothing about the project by <u>anyone</u> until more than a year after RBM began the permitting process.

At every point that parents have tried to meet directly with RBM about the project, RBM has refused.
