RULES, ELECTIONS, AND INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTIONS relative to establishing the City's position regarding the California Drought, Water, Parks, Climate, Coastal Protection and Outdoor Access for All Act of 2018.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

1. ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2017-18 State Legislative Program, SUPPORT for SB 5 (De Leon) and the California Drought, Water, Parks, Climate, Coastal Protection and Outdoor Access for All Act of 2018 which would place a \$4 billion general obligation bond for parks, water, infrastructure and environmental restoration on the June 2018 ballot. (Council file [C.F.] No. 18-0002)
2. ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION (Blumenfield - Harris-Dawson) to include in the City's 2017-18 State Legislative Program, SUPPORT for SB 5 (De Leon) which would place a \$3.5 billion parks and water bond on the June 2018 election ballot. (C.F. No. 18-0002-S6)

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA). The City Administrative Officer has not completed a financial analysis of this report.

SUMMARY

At a special meeting held on March 23, 2018, the Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered a CLA report and Resolution relative to establishing the City's position regarding the California Drought, Water, Parks, Climate, Coastal Protection and Outdoor Access for All Act of 2018 which would place a \$4 billion general obligation bond for parks, water, infrastructure and environmental restoration on the June 2018 ballot, and Resolution (Blumenfield - Harris-Dawson) which also concerns placing a parks and water bond on the June 2018 ballot.

After consideration, and after providing an opportunity for public comment, the Committee approved the CLA Resolution, as amended to include support for SB 5 (De Leon), and Resolution (Blumenfield - Harris-Dawson). This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
