TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the establishment of parking restrictions on certain street segments in Council District 13.

Recommendations for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (O'Farrell - Ryu):

- RESOLVE, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section (LAMC) 80.69.4 and California Vehicle Code Section 22507, to hereby prohibit the parking of vehicles that are in excess of 22 feet in length or over seven feet in height, during the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am along the following street segments:
 - a. Hobart Boulevard between Romaine Street and Lemon Grove Avenue
 - b. Lemon Grove Avenue between Hobart Boulevard and North Kingsley Drive.
- 2. DIRECT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT), upon approval of this action, to post signs giving notice of a *Tow Away, No Parking* restriction for oversize vehicles on the streets listed above in Recommendation No. 1.
- 3. DIRECT the LADOT, upon adoption of this Resolution, to initiate the necessary procedures for the preparation and sale of overnight parking permits, as specified in LAMC Section 80.69.4(c).
- 4. AUTHORIZE the LADOT to make any technical corrections or clarifications to the above instructions in order to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

On February 14, 2018, your Committee considered a Resolution (O'Farrell - Ryu) relative to the establishment of parking restrictions along the following street segments in Council District 13:

- a. Hobart Boulevard between Romaine Street and Lemon Grove Avenue
- b. Lemon Grove Avenue between Hobart Boulevard and North Kingsley Drive.

According to the Resolution, public safety issues have arisen on several streets adjacent to the Lemon Grove Recreation Center where large vehicles park overnight and constrict travel lanes on the roadway, thereby creating dangerous situations. After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to recommend approval of the Resolution as detailed in the above recommendations. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
