

Dos hombres armados con rifles oscuros no identificados se acercaron a ellos a pie, sacaron sus pistolas y les dispararon a los hermanos McLendon varias veces antes de huir. Los hermanos McLendon fueron transportados al California Hospital donde Reginald McLendon succumbió a sus heridas. Gregory McLendon sobrevivió a sus heridas y luego fue dado de alta. Hasta la fecha, los detectives que investigan este crimen no han sido capaces de identificar a los responsables de este crimen, y creen que una recompensa mostraría puede dirigir a los miembros del público a proporcionar información relacionada con los disparos de los hermanos McLendon.
