Summary: There were 12 items in this Council File. See attached for the LBNCs votes. The basic consensus is that NCs should determine what is best for their communities. Too much oversight means too much red tape. DONE/BONC should be working FOR NCs vs NCs working for DONE/BONC.

Lake Balboa NC Response to CF18-0467 at a Special Meeting on 8/19/18

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment be INSTRUCTED, with assistance as needed from the CLA, CAO, City Clerk and City Attorney, to report back within 60 days on the following:

1. Recommendations and next steps for amending City Charter Article IX to change the name of the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE) to the Neighborhood Councils Department (NCD), the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners (BONC) to the Neighborhood Councils Commission (NCC), and phasing out the use of the term/branding 'EmpowerLA' due to the confusion reported by the public and the perception of Neighborhood Council members that DONE's role should be primarily to support Neighborhood Councils, which the name Neighborhood Councils Department would better reflect.

LBNC VOTE to SUPPORT 10 AYES, 2 OPPOSED. Those that opposed - DONE will still be DONE only by a different name/DONE needs to be changed. Another thought there was so many other issues of more importance, why spend time on this?

2. Recommendations and next steps for amending the Los Angeles Administrative Code to remove the "Community Impact Stakeholder," which has caused substantial confusion and disputed elections, and recommendations and next steps for including specific additional definitions by ordinance of eligible voters and board members of Neighborhood Councils, such as student or parent/guardian of a student.

LBNC VOTE to SUPPORT if amended to retain a NC's right to determine who its stakeholders should be. LBNC VOTE 12 AYES, 0 OPPOSED as amended. The consensus was that EACH NC should decide for themselves.

3. Recommendations and next steps for amending City Charter Article IX Section 901.d and 904.f to remove any reference to "selections" and clarify that Neighborhood Council board members will be elected. Neighborhood Council "selection" processes are utilized by a limited and decreasing number of councils and are not viewed by the public as being as democratic as elections as they do not provide for a secret ballot or equitable participation.

LBNC VOTE to OPPOSE : 12 AYES to oppose, 0 OPPOSED the opposition. The consensus was that EACH NC should decide for themselves. To be uniform is for control and ease of a process for city employees vs what is best for NCs.

4. Recommendations and next steps for creating a one-time review process, overseen by the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners, to evaluate Neighborhood Council bylaws to determine if board seats are equitably allocated amongst stakeholder types and provide formal suggestions to Neighborhood Councils on ways to adjust board seats as needed to increase equity.

LBNC VOTE TO OPPOSE 12 AYES to OPPOSE, 0 Opposed the opposition. BONC oversees the certification of a NC, that is enough. The discussion was these are appointees by the Mayor. Currently there is a disinterested board member. We don't want BONC telling us what to do.

5. Recommendations and next steps for adopting regulations to provide a uniform minimum voting age and board member age to allow consistent participation across the City, and what that age should be.

LBNC VOTE TO OPPOSE: 12 AYES to OPPOSE, 0 Opposed the opposition. Each NC should decide what is best for their community.

6. Recommendations and next steps for developing and adopting a planning and land use training required for all Chairs and Vice-Chairs of Neighborhood Council planning and land use committees.

**LBNC VOTE TO SUPPORT: 12 AYES, 0 Oppose, Discussion was to remember we are volunteers with limited time.**

I FURTHER MOVE that the City Clerk be INSTRUCTED, with assistance as needed from the CLA, CAO, DONE and City Attorney, to report back within 60 days on the following:

7. Recommendations and next steps on a process for Neighborhood Councils to be able to roll-over a non-cumulative maximum of \$10,000 in any given fiscal year.

**LBNC VOTE TO SUPPORT IF AMENDED to roll over UNLIMITED funds to the next fiscal year. LBNC VOTED 12 AYES, 0 Opposed rolling over UNLIMITED funds.**

8. Recommendations and next steps for removing Section 5.485.h of Chapter 88 of Division 5 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code (Ordinance 179545; see Council File 03-1260), and recommendations for other amendments to that Chapter, in order to remove the expiration of the ability for Neighborhood Councils to accept in-kind or monetary donations.

**LBNC VOTE TO SUPPORT the removal of the expiration 12AYE, 0 OPPOSED**

9. On the costs and other implications of holding all Neighborhood Council elections on the same day in order to provide for a uniform citywide advertising and outreach campaign.

**LBNC VOTE TO OPPOSE: 10 AYE, 2 OPPOSED, This would be something to aspire to but the city clerk is nowhere ready to handle 99 NCs, with 15-25 seats with multiple candidates for each seat. The cost would be astronomical compared the cost of advertising and outreach.**

I FURTHER MOVE that the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment, and all relevant departments denoted below, be INSTRUCTED to:

10. Develop a process, with the assistance of GSD and the City Clerk, to assist Neighborhood Councils with accessing shared space in City facilities, as envisioned in Council File 16-0298.

**LBNC VOTE TO SUPPORT, 12 AYES, 0 OPPOSED**

11. Develop an ongoing compendium of best practices generated from Neighborhood Councils and share those on a periodic basis with all Neighborhood Councils and include 'how-to guides' for accomplishing those best practices.

**LBNC VOTE TO SUPPORT, 12 AYES, 0 OPPOSED, isn't this DONE's job already?**

12. Develop point of contact lists for key city departments and agencies, including DCP, DOT, Public Works' Bureaus, Aging, Disability, HCID, DCA, LADWP, Port, Airport, Cannabis Regulation, Emergency Management, Animal Services, LAPD, LAFD, Recreation and Parks, Zoo, Finance, Library, Economic and Workforce Development and BIDs, with assistance from those listed departments and agencies, and share those lists with Neighborhood Councils, facilitate the training of those points of contact at those relevant departments on the most fruitful ways to assist and communicate with Neighborhood Council members, and coordinate with Neighborhood Councils to formally appoint a point of contact at each NC to communicate between each NC and the point of contact at each department, thus creating a single line of communication.
