SUBJECT:

Temporary Closure of Cul-de-Sac Walkway at Woodbine Street Northeasterly of Manning Avenue – Council File No. 18-0619

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- A. That the walkway as shown on the attached sketch, subject to the conditions contained herein, be temporarily closed pursuant to State Vehicle Code Section 21101.4 for a period of eighteen (18) months upon Council approval.
- B. That the City Council find that this is categorically exempt under Article III, Class 5, of the Los Angeles City Guidelines for the implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970.
- C. That the City Council adopt the accompanying Resolution signed by the City Attorney.
- D. That the City Council adopt the following findings:
 - 1. There is substantial evidence of serious and continual criminal activities in the walkway recommended for temporary closure.
 - 2. The temporary closure of the walkway will reduce the criminal activity in the area.
 - 3. The walkway does not provide necessary vehicular or pedestrian access to adjacent properties but affected property owners have agreed to the temporary closure.
 - 4. The closure will not substantially adversely affect traffic flow, safety on adjacent streets or in the surrounding neighborhoods, the operation of emergency vehicles or the performance of municipal or public utility services in the walkway proposed to be temporarily closed.

- 5. Vehicular and pedestrian traffic on the street contributes to the criminal activities.
- 6. The walkway has not been designated as a through highway or arterial street.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

The Bureau of Engineering is absorbing the cost of processing the request in the approximate amount of \$5,000.00. Maintenance of the public easement by City forces will be eliminated.

CONDITIONS:

1. That any gates to be installed to effectuate a physical closure of the walkway area together with the gate locations be approved by the Fire Department, and the

Department of Water and Power and the Department of Transportation and the Bureau of Sanitation's Wastewater Collection Systems Division and be done under appropriate permits issued by the City Engineer and be installed at no cost to the City.

- 2. That the keys to any gates to be installed be provided to all affected City Departments and Public Utility Companies.
- 3. That the closed area be physically closed within 6 months of Council approval of the temporary closure or the approval be rescinded.
- 4. That the petitioners agree to remove the gates/fences upon termination of the allowed closure period at no cost to the City.

DISCUSSION:

On August 14, 2018, under Council File No. 18-0619 a motion from Council District No. 5 was adopted by the City Council directing the City Engineer to initiate proceedings to close the walkway located along Manning Avenue leading to the cul-de-sac at Woodbine Street.

Comment from General Public:

The Bureau of Engineering received communication from thirteen property owners in support of this closure. Those property owners are substantially shown as colored green on Exhibit B.

Nina Paul, owner of the 3274 Woodbine Street, stated in her email communication dated November 23, 2018 that she is distraught over the ongoing criminal activity in her neighborhood. She had to install a more sophisticated alarm system, a new garage door and several very expensive locks on doors and windows to help the renters with their fears. Etan Orgel, tenant of 3274 Woodbine Street, stated in a communication dated November 21, 2018 that they have become increasingly concerned with the growing crime rates in our neighborhood, that includes serious criminal activity such as the rise in burglaries and home invasions.

Norman Sugano, the homeowner of 3278 Woodbine Street, sent an email on November 7, 2018 "to express full support for the proposed locking gate at the Woodbine cul-de-sac." He also stated that "the crime rate in our neighborhood has increased to an intolerable rate. Our neighbors at 3292 Woodbine have been victims of a home invasion with the attacker being found in the bedroom of their child. We are a neighborhood of mainly seniors and young families and are being too easily victimized."

Asad Madni, residing at 3281 Woodbine Street stated in his email communication dated November 7, 2018 that he "unconditionally and in the strongest manner support" the initiative of the walkway closure and views it as imperative to the protection of the

neighborhood and families. He also stated that the neighbors of his block are currently facing numerous problems, which include theft of cars, vagrancy, and neighbors being subjected to defecation and littering.

The resident of 3282 Woodbine Street, Carmela Ma, expressed concerns for safety of homes in the cul-de-sac in a letter addressed to the Land Development & GIS Division. The letter mentioned that a neighbor's home was robbed in the middle of the night and robber was not concerned that residents might be in their homes.

Jerome Becker and Dorthea Bernstein, who live at 3285 Woodbine Street, stated in a letter addressed to the Land Development & GIS Division, mentioned a recent string of home break-ins and drug paraphernalia left in the walkway.

David Rodman, residing at 3288 Woodbine Street, in a letter dated October 16, 2018, stated his strong support for the requested closure of the cul-de-sac walkway. He stated that his car was broken into earlier this year parked in his driveway. Mention of recent increase of level of crime was made, which included some already previously mentioned in this report. He also made note of how Edith Street, a cul-de-sac one block over, had similar issues before they were granted the closure of their walkway, and now he believes that their issues have decreased.

In a letter dated November 14, 2018, Maurine Fleischman, on behalf of her family, residing at 3293 Woodbine Street, expressed concern about recent crime in the neighborhood. She believes a locked gate will increase the safety of all residents on her street, requesting authorization as soon as possible for a locked gate to be placed at the end of the cul-de-sac.

A letter dated November 7, 2018, written by Cynthia Hinds of 3289 Woodbine Street, wanted to inform the Land Development & GIS Division that her cars being stolen and ransacked and other neighbors having their homes broken into while they are present.

Scott Voelz and his wife, Lauri Hughes, homeowners of 3292 Woodbine Street, stated their support for the closure of the pathway at the end of Woodbine Street leading to Manning Avenue. Their letter, dated November 11, 2018, made note that their residence was burglarized on October 16, 2018. They believe a locked gate would help reduce criminal activity.

On November 7, 2018, Ned Joseph who resides at 3296 Woodbine Street, sent an email to Edmond Yew, writing about a significant increase in criminal activity and vagrancy issues on Woodbine Street. Recent crimes included littering and defecation that neighbors are forced to clean, break-in of a neighbor's home, and theft. In addition, quality of life has drastically diminished for the residents and that it is very important to close public access to this walkway as soon as possible.

In an email from Andy and Eileen Geller dated November 8, 2018, home owner of 3297 Woodbine Street, expressed that the walkway has been a continuing concern for the residents of the area. They also stated that the entire block of residents has already signed a petition to

close and gate the walkway. They made note of one neighbor being vandalized, another having their car stolen, and an attempt by a robber trying to gain access to their home.

The Burau of Engineering received communication from three property owners along with 59 petition signatures, in opposition of this closure. Those properties are substantially shown as colored red on Exhibit B.

An objection letter from Vinod Mapranath, dated October 3, 2018, along with a petition has been received by the Land Development & GIS Division. The petition had been signed by fifty-nine other residents within the Fifth Council District, all of which resided on either Manning Court or Manning Avenue. The letter voiced the concerns of the adjacent communities losing access to other parts of the neighborhood. Complaints of lack of public notice by letters and posted signs had not been addressed in the letter. Similar criminal activity, which was previously mentioned by the residents of Woodbine, is a problem to the residents nearby as well. As a suggestion, instead of closing the walkway, the letter advocates for a more regular police patrol of the area to protect against criminal activity.

A separate letter from Evelyn Reason dated October 20, 2018, owner of 3370 Manning Court, objected to the closure of the walkway. The letter stated that she is walking most days of the week to stay healthy and it would be a hardship for her if the Woodbine public walkway were closed.

Josh Johnson, owner of 3375 Manning Court, stated in a letter dated October 21, 2018 that "this walkway has provided the safest path for us to access the community. Closing it would force us to go downhill on a busy street to get around the neighborhood." He also stated that he is concerned by the lack of proper notification of the proposed closure to residents in the immediate areas.

Comment from Public Agencies:

Commanding Officer, Captain Vic Davalos of the Los Angeles Police Department, West Los Angeles Area sent a letter dated February 4, 2019, wrote "The purpose of the correspondence is to request that a criminal closure be installed at the cul-de-sac at the end of Woodbine Street at the intersection of Manning Avenue. The Los Angeles Police Department, West Los Angeles Community Police Station, has received numerous complaints regarding burglary, theft, vandalism, destruction of property, and a decline in the quality of life due to an increase in the homeless population and activities related to homelessness."

The previous Commanding Officer of the Los Angeles Police Department, West Los Angeles Area, Captain Thomas Valencia sent a letter dated November 19, 2018. In the letter he wrote, "This correspondence is in response to the Land Development and GIS Division, Bureau of Engineering letter received by the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) wherein the Fifth Council District is considering a temporary closure of the walkway located at Woodbine Street northeasterly of Manning Avenue. The LAPD was asked to provide comments and/or recommendations related to criminal activity in the

above referenced area. As per the request, a crime analysis was conducted which revealed a slight increase in overall crime. After a review of the analysis, West Los Angeles Area is not opposed to the above referenced closure."

Also, the Bureau of Engineering received two Los Angeles Police Department Investigation Reports dated 9/14/2018 and 10/16/2018 over the properties at 3288 Woodbine Street and 3292 Woodbine Street, respectively.

Department of Transportation stated in its communication date October 30, 2018 that "DOT has no comments and does not oppose the closure."

Bureau of Engineering also received a communication from Los Angeles Fire Department dated October 16, 2018 that "The Fire Department has no objection to this Temporary Closure."

Department of City Planning did not respond to the Bureau of Engineering referral letter dated September 11, 2018.

Conclusion:

The temporary closure of the cul-de-sac walkway at Woodbine Street northeasterly of Manning Ave is feasible. The Los Angeles Police Department, Los Angeles Fire Department and Los Angeles Department of Transportation do not oppose the closure.
