 Dear Chairman Harris-Dawson, and members Blumenfield, Price, Cedillo and Smith and City Attorney Mike Feuer and L.A. Planning Commissioner David Ambroz:

The Two Digital billboards that are planned for the 170 freeway between Oxnard and Victory would be: "the brightest, largest digital signs in the valley located at this project and do create a public danger by distracting drivers on the freeway."

At this very moment they are building a SOUND WALL between Magnolia and Victory that has in itself signs, concrete blocks, equipment and men working that are enough of a distraction. Not only that, there are times when they close off the Oxnard off ramp and divert all traffic to the Victory off ramp which creates a back up of cars.

Paul Krekorian has sided with the developer against the wishes of the community. If he had his way right from the beginning without the opposition of strong neighborhood associations (excluding the neighborhood council) there would have been 754 apartments, as many neon signs as possible with flashing lights, no mitigation and whatever the developer asked for in the beginning. Why he's taking such efforts to block what his constituents want is a mystery. He is supposed to represent us. Yes, we all want the development, but since we live there and the developer doesn't, Paul Krekorian doesn't, there are some specifications needed for public safety, environment and aesthetics

I agree with the Planning Commission, which has DENIED THE DEVELOPER APPROVAL of these digital displays twice and was upheld as appropriate by our City Attorney, Mike Feuer.

Since we cannot rely on our elected area representative to respect our needs, we are petitioning PLUM directly to please VOTE AGAINST THIS APPEAL.
