Dear Commissioners,

This letter is in response to the request by Mr. Nazarian to remove more dirt from 11667 Bellagio Road. This is in addition to the 2,874 cubic yards he has already removed. Mr. Nazarian has blatantly and boldly disrespected the building codes, the laws in place, the neighbors and neighborhood. I don't believe he had any intention of submitting his actual plans to the city knowing it was in direct violation of the hillside ordinances and building codes. He has MANY violations against him up to this date. As far as I am concerned, he should not be allowed to take any more dirt whatsoever. If this request is approved, I believe it should be met with these conditions to protect the neighbors:

### Conditions

1. Mr. Nazarian, resign his position of owner builder. The city shall no longer recognize Mr. Nazarian in the capacity of contractor/foreman.

Nazarian shall hire or retain a fully licensed and accredited building contractor with proof of current license, bond, insurance and all city licenses.

Sub-contractors must be state licensed, bonded and insured. Any employees working under contractors shall be provided workman's comp, unemployment insurance, and disability and fitted with proper safety gear. Licensed contractors shall be present when work is performed. Contractors must be familiar with hillside construction and must follow all codes and ordinances imposed by city.

2. A new geology report shall be performed by a state licensed and recognized geologist to be determined by and agreed upon by both parties. The geologist shall perform and submit a comprehensive report stating the current findings, the true stability of the hillside and any possible impacts of removing more soil. The report shall be submitted to city, Nazarian and the homeowners. This report is to be paid entirely by Nazarian. Any questionable conditions shall be resolved before any more soil is removed from the hillside.

3. Nazarian issue a notarized letter to each affected homeowner within a 300-foot radius of the grading site, claiming financial responsibility in the event of hillside failure.

Dear Commissioners,

I am a neighbor within the 300-foot range of the grading site.

I believe the applicant's request should be denied until:

1. The applicant hires a legitimate licensed and bonded contractor that has experience with hillside development to complete the project.

2. That if more earth is to be removed, another geological assessment be made, by an unbiased geologist, so that we know our surrounding houses are safe from land movement. (A neighbor's geology report is attached, that has quite a different conclusion than the applicant's geology report).

3. That Nazarian resolves any hauling issues (pictures of violations attached).

4. That the site be secured to insure neighborhood safety. Since this project began, there has been a significant increase in home break-ins and car thefts. The construction site was covered

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with gang graffiti for months and a make shift chain-link fence was placed in the street instead of on the applicants property blocking parking for residents.

PS - We are wondering why he needs to remove more dirt?
