REQUEST TO APPROVE THE RESULTS OF THE AMERICA'S JOB CENTER OF

CALIFORNIA (CITY WORKSOURCE CENTER) OPERATORS REQUEST FOR

PROPOSALS AND RELATED ACTIONS

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Council, subject to the approval of the Mayor:

- 1. Approve the results of the 2018 Request for Proposals (RFP) for the America's Job Center of California (AJCC) (WorkSource Centers) Operators as recommended by the Economic and Workforce Development Department (EWDD) and listed in the Attachment to this report;
- 2. Authorize the General Manager, EWDD, or designee to:
 - a. Negotiate and execute contracts with the 15 service providers identified in the Attachment to this report to operate 16 AJCC/WorkSource Center sites for a term from January 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019, with three one-year renewal options through June 30, 2022, with funding in an amount not to exceed \$446,344 per site for six months in WIOA Title | Formula Funds, subject to review and approval of the City Attorney as to form and legality and compliance with City contracting requirements;
 - b. Establish the Eligible AJCC Operator Replacement List to include any AJCC proposer not recommended as an AJCC/WorkSource Center and with a score of 70 points or higher as included in the Attachment;
 - c. Negotiate and execute agreements and/or amendments to agreements with the public, private, non-profit and/or governmental entities listed in the Attachment regarding additional funds including but not limited to WIOA Governor's Discretionary Grants, National Dislocated Worker Grants, Department of Justice Grants, Department of Education Grants, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Grants, City of Los Angeles General Fund, subject to the Workforce Development Board-Local Elected Officials Agreement, review and approval of the City Attorney as to form and

legality, and compliance with City contracting requirements;

- d. Expend from Account No. 22R581, WIOA Adult, and 22R582, WIOA Dislocated Worker, within the WIOA Fund No. 57W up to a total of \$446,344 for each AJCC/WorkSource Center; and,
- e. Make technical corrections as necessary to transactions included in this report to implement Mayor and Council intentions, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer.

SUMMARY

In a Transmittal dated November 15, 2018 (Transmittal) (C.F. 18-1092), the Economic and Workforce Development Department (EWDD) requests approval of 15 service providers to operate 16 City WorkSource Center (WSC) sites, known nationally as America's Job Centers of California (AJCC), EWDD selected the recommended service providers as a result of a Request for Proposals (RFP) process. The contract term is from January 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019 with three oneyear renewal options for a maximum term through June 30, 2022. EWDD states that six months of Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) grant funding in the total amount of \$7,141,504 (\$446,344 per site) has been approved for the 16 WSC sites in the Program Year 2018-19 Workforce Development Board (WDB) Annual Plan (C.F. 18-0543). The Attachment to this report includes the bidders in the RFP, their scores, and the recommended contract awards, if any, in the last column on the right. EWDD also requests authority to: 1) negotiate and execute contracts with the selected service providers subject to review and approval of the City Attorney as to form and legality and in compliance with City contracting requirements; 2) establish a list of Eligible AJCC Operator Replacement list consisting of seven bidders that scored 70 or higher and are not currently recommended as WSC operators; and 3) expend funds for the WSC contracts. Our Office recommends approval of EWDD's requests.

Pursuant to Los Angeles City Charter Section 1022, the Personnel Department determined that there are two city classifications that could potentially perform the requested services at EWDD, Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA), and the Department of Aging (Aging). EWDD states that the work is of limited duration and exceeds their own Department capacity. Neither LAWA nor Aging responded to inquiries regarding their staff availability to perform these services. Moreover, the grantor requires implementation of the services through multiple stand-alone regional sites across the City. On July 10, 2018, our Office recommended that EWDD be permitted to contract for the WSC services because the work exceeds City staff availability and Department locations, and would be more feasibly performed by contract than by City employees.

DISCUSSION

The current contracts for the WSC expired on June 30, 2018 and were extended through December 31, 2018. EWDD released the AJCC RFP on August 27, 2018 with responses due October 9, 2018. The RFP solicited proposals from organizations interested in providing services as a WIOA

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workforce development services operator, known nationally as an AJCC and locally as a WSC. Each proposal was required to address services to be provided in one of the seven City Regional Planning Commission Areas: East, South, Central, West, Harbor, South Valley, and North Valley. Agencies were limited to submitting no more than two proposals each. Selected proposers may also be expected to implement additional workforce grant programs, including, but not limited to WIOA Governor's Discretionary Grants, National Dislocated Worker Grants, Department of Justice Grants, Department of Education Grants, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Grants, City of Los Angeles General Fund funded programs, Los Angeles County funded programs, and/or private industry grants as determined by the City Council, the Mayor, the City of Los Angeles WDB and/or EWDD. Services requested under the RFP include a full range of assistance and services under one roof for job seekers such as individuals with barriers to employment, workers who have been laid off, youth, incumbent workers, new entrants to the workforce, veterans, people with disabilities, and employers. The RFP focused on organizations strengthening employer engagement with regional economic drivers and industries, addressing vulnerable populations with a geographic focus, and providing integration of key partner services.

A total of 24 proposals were received from 17 agencies, covering all the Planning Areas. One proposal was incomplete, lacking required forms, and was deemed nonresponsive in accordance with the RFP. Additional information about the evaluation process, scoring, criteria, and appeals is included in the Transmittal.

Notifications regarding the results and scores of the proposals were sent on October 30, 2018. Appeals were accepted regarding procedural issues only. A total of seven appeals were received by the appeal submission deadline of November 6, 2018. In accordance with the WDB-Local Elected Officials Agreement, the WDB Appeals Board held an appeals hearing on November 13, 2018. A total of five appeals were eventually withdrawn by the bidders and two appeals were denied by the appeals board.

The final scores and EWDD's recommendations for contract funding are included in the Attachment to this report. Proposals with scores of 70 or above that are not currently recommended for funding are recommended to be placed on an Eligible AJCC Operator Replacement List from which EWDD will draw replacement contractors in the event that an agency selected as a WSC is unable to perform. Each agency's site is also required to comply with WIOA regulations and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

There is no impact to the General Fund. The recommendations in this report comply with the City Financial Policies in that Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) grant funds provide funding for the America's Job Center of California/City WorkSource Center (WSC) sites. WIOA funding was approved for the WSC in the Program Year 2018-19 Workforce Development Board Annual Plan (C.F. 18-0543).
