## MOTION

The Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) has announced the availability of \$2.7 million in grant funds for Future Communities Pilot Programs. The funds are designed to help cities use technology and data solutions to reduce vehicle miles traveled (VMT). Grant applications are due December 13, 2018. The maximum project award is \$500,000 and each grant application requires a 25% local match. SCAG has noted that applications will be scored on rationale, design, readiness and sustainability.

The Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) is seeking authorization to submit a \$500,000 grant application entitled "The City of Los Angeles Future Communities Pilot Project" that would include the following technology elements:

- Mobility Data Specification (MDS) for Dockless Bike Share, e-scooters, and other shared ride providers;
- Expansion of the City's Carshare Programs; and
- VMT reduction analysis to calculate the effectiveness of Transportation Demand Management (TDM) strategies and set priorities for allocating carshare resources.

These pilot projects promote new policy development, improve processes for government service provision, and enable testing of innovative engagement practices with private sector mobility providers.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council AUTHORIZE the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) to apply for, accept funds and execute any necessary agreements in an amount up to \$500,000 for the Southern California Association of Governments' Future Communities Pilot Program entitled "The City of Los Angeles Future Communities Pilot Project" that would include LADOT's Mobility Data Specification project; the City's carshare programs; and vehicles miles traveled reduction analysis.
