

ENERGY, CLIMATE CHANGE, AND ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE REPORT relative to authorizing the Bureau of Street Services (BSS) to accept funds to perform enforcement, compliance and/or surveillance activities at waste tire facilities.

Recommendation for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

AUTHORIZE the BSS and Investigation and Enforcement Division to accept funds allocated for Fiscal Years (FY) 2018-19 through FY 2023-24, from the California Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) to perform enforcement, compliance and/or surveillance activities at waste tire facilities.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The Board of Public Works (BPW) reports that acceptance of these funds will lessen the burden on the General Fund as the General Fund provides funding for the current Street Services Investigator, illegal dumping and waste tire enforcements efforts, which address serious quality of life issues in the communities where illegal dumping is an ongoing battle.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY:

At its regular meeting held on December 4, 2018, the Energy, Climate Change, and Environmental Justice Committee considered a BPW report relative to authorizing the BSS and Investigation and Enforcement Division to accept funds allocated for FY 2018-19 through FY 2023-24, from the CalRecycle for grants to local enforcement agencies, cities and counties in order to perform enforcement, compliance and/or surveillance activities at waste tire facilities.

After providing an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to approve the recommendation contained in the BPW report, as detailed above. This matter is now transmitted to the Council for its consideration.
