In a regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, December 5th, 2018, the HHWNC board voted (19 yay 0 nay) in support of Council File #18-1120 that the Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD) and Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) jointly assemble and lead a Wildland-Urban Interface Hazard Mitigation Task Force (Task Force), consisting of representatives from the Police Department, Emergency Management Department, Department of Transportation, Department of Recreation and Parks, Department of Animal Services, Information Technology Agency, Department of Neighborhood Empowerment, Department of Building & Safety, Department of City Planning, Department of Water & Power, and any other internal and external partners deemed necessary, to discuss the issues described in the attached text along with any related matters. Additionally that the LAFD and CLA jointly convene an initial meeting of the Task Force, and provide a written report to the City Council outlining the work and objectives going forward. The HHWNC's stakeholder base is very concerned about the current fire risk in the hills and neighboring communities. We also passed our own motion to have a community event in conjunction with the Hollywood United Neighborhood Council in the first quarter of 2019 with representatives from Los Angeles Fire Department, Los Angeles Police Department, Department of Transportation, Council District 4, Council District 13, etc., to address emergency services, evacuation, geography and traffic restrictions.
