RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

- 2. That the Board TRANSMIT the attached grant application and award, pursuant to Administrative Code Section 14.6(a), to the Mayor, Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO), Office of the Chief Legislative Analyst, and the City Clerk for committee and City Council consideration.
- That the Board REQUEST the Mayor and City Council to:
 - A. AUTHORIZE the Chief of Police to retroactively apply for and ACCEPT the grant award of \$451,638.91 for the 2018 Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP) Grant from the Bureau of Justice Assistance, United States Department of Justice, for the period of April 1. 2018, to August 31, 2020;
 - B. AUTHORIZE the Controller to set up a grant receivable and appropriate \$451,638.91 to appropriation account, account number to be determined, within Fund No. 339, Department No. 70, for the receipt and disbursement of BVP Grant funds;
 - C. AUTHORIZE the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to submit grant reimbursement requests to the grantor and deposit the grant receipts in Fund No. 339, Department No. 70;
 - D. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to spend up to the total grant amount of \$451,638.91 in accordance with the grant award agreement;
 - E. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to prepare the Controller's instructions for any necessary technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the CAO, and instruct the Controller to implement the instructions.

DISCUSSION

The LAPD has been a recipient of the BVP Grant for 14 years. Because of grant funding, LAPD has been able to purchase National Institute of Justice compliant armored vests for police officers.

The Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, will reimburse the Department fifty percent of the cost of each vest purchased. The grant will provide funding for approximately 1,500 replacement vests. The Department has participated in the BVP Program for 14 years with total funding awarded in the amount of \$3,246,873.14.
