SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR PAYMENT OF REWARD OFFER (DR NO. 16-0328013)

## RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

1. That the Board of Police Commissioners (Board) REVIEW and APPROVE the attached Application for Special Reward Payment.

2. That the Board TRANSMIT to the Mayor and City Council the Application for Special Reward Payment for review and approval.

#### DISCUSSION

It is requested that the Board approve and transmit to the City Council the recommendation that a \$25,000 reward be paid to Claimant.

On Monday, December 26, 2016, at approximately 1540 hours, a vehicle versus bicyclist hit and run traffic collision occurred at the intersection of 48<sup>th</sup> Street and 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The driver of the vehicle failed to stop and identify himself or render aid to the injured bicyclist. Unfazed by the traffic collision, the driver fled the scene and proceeded to hide his vehicle under a tarp to the rear of his residence. The bicyclist sustained severe injuries and was transported to California Hospital in grave condition and was later transported by helicopter to the University Southern California Medical Center (USCMC). The victim's injuries included bleeding on the brain, a skull fracture, crushed aorta, fractured face, fractured right femur, and internal injuries.

On December 28, 2016, a citizen became aware of the Hit and Run Reward Program and contacted South Traffic Division Detectives and provided the location of hit and run driver and the vehicle. The citizen provided the name: Javier Saravia Merlos and residence address of 4515 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Los Angeles, California 90043. The citizen also stated that the suspect's vehicle was parked in the rear of the complex, covered with a tarp. Based on the information provided by the community member, detectives formulated a tactical plan to arrest Merlos.

On December 30, 2016, detectives responded to the location and took Merlos into custody without incident. Merlos was arrested and booked for Section 20001(A) "Felony Hit and Run" of the California Vehicle Code. After lengthy criminal proceedings, Merlos admitted to the crime at the Preliminary Hearing and received a two-year prison sentence (Case Number CNBA45358201/LA) on November 13, 2017. South Traffic Division is thankful for the community member's bravery and assistance in bringing this case to a successful resolution.

SUBJECT: PAYMENT OF HIT AND RUN REWARD FOR DR NO. 1603-28013

Due to an increase in the number of hit and run traffic collisions, the Los Angeles City Council created the Hit and Run Reward Program to engage and seek the community's assistance to identify and deter hit and run drivers.

On Monday, December 26, 2016, at approximately 1540 hours, a Vehicle Versus Bicyclist Hit and Run Collision occurred at the intersection of 48th Street and 9th Avenue. The driver of the vehicle failed to stop and identify himself or render aid to the injured bicyclist. Unfazed by the collision, the driver fled the scene and went home and hid his vehicle in the rear of his residence. The bicyclist sustained severe injuries and was transported to California Hospital in grave condition. He was later flown by helicopter to University Southern California Medical Center (USCMC). The victim's injuries included bleeding on the brain, skull fracture, crushed aorta, fractured face, fractured right femur, and internal injuries.

On December 28 2016, a citizen became aware of the Hit and Run Reward Program and contacted South Traffic Division Detectives and provided the location of the hit and run driver, and his vehicle. Merlos admitted to the crime and at the Preliminary Hearing received a two-year prison sentence. Case Number CNBA45358201/LA. South Traffic Division is thankful for the citizen's bravery, and assistance in bringing this case to a successful resolution.
