We, the Wilshire Center - Koreatown Neighborhood Council (WCKNC) of the City of Los Angeles, OPPOSE the adoption of City Council File 19-0002-S39, a city council resolution opposing State Senate Bill 58 (Wiener), which would allow select cities in California to issue permits extending the cut off time for alcohol sales to 4 a.m.

SB58 does not mandate that cities allow alcohol sales until 4 a.m. Rather, the bill gives cities, like Los Angeles, the option to select neighborhoods for a 4 a.m. cut off time. Most importantly, the bill requires public participation to identify these neighborhoods and businesses.

Wilshire Center - Koreatown is one neighborhood that could reap potential benefits from a later cutoff time. Already, the neighborhood has a vibrant nightlife, with many businesses open well past 2 a.m. While we do not take a position on extended alcohol sales at this time, we believe the city and our stakeholders should have the option to decide this matter for themselves.

Therefore, the WCKNC opposes the resolution (Koretz - Smith) to oppose State Senate Bill 58 (Wiener), which would allow select cities in California to issue permits extending the cut off time for alcohol sales to 4 a.m. and encourages city officials to work with state leaders to address outstanding concerns.
