

RULES, ELECTIONS, AND INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT relative to establishing the City's position regarding SB 658 (Bradford), which would expand access to the Track and Trace Program's database.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Wesson - Harris-Dawson), SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2019-20 State Legislative Program, SUPPORT for SB 658 (Bradford) which would expand access to the Track and Trace Program's database to local jurisdictions and establish a statewide retail cannabis emblem program to identify safe and legal cannabis businesses.

SUMMARY

At a special meeting held on April 16, 2019, the Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered a Resolution relative to establishing the City's position to support SB 658 (Bradford), which would expand access to the Track and Trace Program's database to local jurisdictions and establish a statewide retail cannabis emblem program to identify safe and legal cannabis businesses.
