## RESOLUTION RULES, ELECTIONS, INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS

WHEREAS, any official position of the City of Los Angeles with respect to legislation, rules, regulations or policies proposed to or pending before a local, state, or federal government body or agency must have first been adopted in the form of a Resolution by the City Council with the concurrence of the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, the United States discards approximately 30 million tons of plastic each year; and

WHEREAS, plastic material is not biodegradable as it simply breaks down into smaller pieces which end up in landfills or polluting the environment; and

WHEREAS, local governments in California spend millions each year to clean up and prevent plastic materials and other litter from entering rivers and streams and polluting the ocean; and

WHEREAS, discarded plastic materials negatively impact marine life, as demonstrated by countless seabirds, turtles, and marine mammals dying from plastic ingestion or entanglement; and

WHEREAS, to address this matter, the State Legislature introduced AB 1080 (Gonzales) and SB 54 (Allen), the California Circular Economy and Plastic Pollution Reduction Act, which would require the State to adopt regulations to reduce and recycle 75% of single-use plastic materials sold or distributed in the State by 2030; and

WHEREAS, these measures would also require a manufacturer of single-use plastic materials in the State to demonstrate a recycling rate of not less than 20% on and after January 1, 2022, and not less than 40% on and after January 1, 2026, as a condition of sale; and

WHEREAS, the City of Los Angeles has been a leader in solid waste diversion and recycling programs for years, achieving the highest recycling rate among large U.S. cities; and

WHEREAS, the City of Los Angeles recently approved the *Plastic Straws-On-Request Ordinance* which will mitigate the impact discarded plastic straws have on marine life and the environment and will improve the quality of life in the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, with the concurrence of the Mayor, that by the adoption of this Resolution, the City of Los Angeles hereby includes in its 2019-2020 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for AB 1080 (Gonzales) and SB 54 (Allen), the *California Circular Economy and Plastic Pollution Act*, which would require the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) to adopt regulations to reduce and recycle 75% of single-use plastic materials sold or distributed in the State by 2030.
