Lyn Shaw-Hilfenhaus is a lifelong resident of the San Fernando Valley whose father was a union carpenter and mother represented engineers and scientists at Lockheed Martin. From an early age, the importance of public service was instilled in her as well as the importance of standing up for vulnerable people and those less fortunate. At about ten years old, she worked on her first presidential campaign helping George McGovern's in 1972. Though electorally unsuccessful, that experience helped inspire her to influence hundreds of elections across the country from presidential races, to congressional elections, to tight battles for school board.

Her interest in electoral politics led to her extensive involvement in the Democratic Party. She was a member of numerous Democratic clubs, started a few herself, served on the Democratic Party of the San Fernando Valley and help many leadership positions over the years. She also was very involved with the State party, having served on the Executive Board, the Rules Committee and as a delegate.

Her career led her down many fascinating public and private sector paths including extensive work with local non-profits. Lyn has always gone above and beyond for the causes that are important to her and served as the chair of the Women's Caucus of the California Democratic Party. Before joining Team Blumenfield, Lyn worked for Tierra Del Sol, a San Fernando Valley based non-profit serving people with Developmental Disabilities.

Lyn was one of Blumenfield's first hires after he was elected to the State Assembly. They had known each other for many years and she helped on his campaign. She has been a critical part of the team ever since and has helped shape his entire legislative agenda. As his District Director, she not only managed the district staff but created supportive family-like environment from which all could thrive individually and collectively.

During the Great Recession as California faced an unprecedented budget crisis, Blumenfield served as the Assembly Budget chair when essentially every state funded program was on the chopping block. Lyn worked tirelessly with Blumenfield to continue funding programs for the developmentally disabled community and helped author AB 1415 which prevented Adult Day Health Care programs from being eliminated. Additionally, she helped shepherd SB 468, which was signed by Governor Brown, creating a statewide Self-Determination Program that offered people with developmental disabilities a choice and control over the services and support they receive. Locally, she helped push the office to hire people with developmental disabilities.

When Blumenfeld was sworn in as a City Councilmember, Lyn continued to serve the West Valley as his District Chief of Staff. In this role, she led his field staff in every aspect, including expanding community outreach, ensuring city services, and helping the West Valley gets it fair share of resources. She is beloved by the community and on a first name basis with every non-profit leader in the area. She is not only accessible, but has been a proactive leader often solving issues before they become problems.
