

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to acceptance of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-2020 Intellectual Property Enforcement (IPE) Program Grant from the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Bureau of Justice Administration.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

1. AUTHORIZE the Chief, Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), or designee, to:
 - a. Retroactively apply for and subsequently accept the grant award in the amount of \$400,000 for the FY 2018-2020 IPE grant from the U.S. DOJ, Bureau of Justice Administration, for the period of October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2020.
 - b. Negotiate and execute the Cooperative Agreement, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form.
2. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to:
 - a. Spend up to the total grant amount of \$400,000 in accordance with the grant award agreement.
 - b. Submit grant reimbursement requests to the grantor and deposit the grant receipts in the Police Department Grants Fund No. 339/70.
 - c. Prepare Controller instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer (CAO); and, authorize the Controller to implement the instructions.
3. AUTHORIZE the Controller to:
 - a. Establish a grant receivable and appropriate \$400,000 to appropriation account, account number to be determined, within Fund No. 339/70, for the receipt and disbursement of 2018-2020 IPE grant funds.
 - b. Increase appropriations for the 2018-2020 IPE grant as needed from appropriation account number to be determined in Fund No. 339/70, to Fund No. 100/70, account number and amount as follows:

Account No. 001092, Sworn Overtime \$ 50,000
 - c. Transfer \$54,555 from Fund No. 339/70, appropriation account number to be determined, to Fund No. 100/12, Account No. 001010 - Salaries, General.

4. AUTHORIZE the City Clerk to:

- a. Place the following action relative to the 2018-2020 IPE grant on the City Council agenda on **July 1, 2019**, or the first meeting day thereafter:

Authorize the Controller to transfer from Fund No. 339/70, account number to be determined, to Fund No. 100/70, account number and amount as follows:

Account No. 001092, Sworn Overtime \$150,000

- b. Place the following action relative to 2018-2020 IPE grant on the City Council agenda on **July 1, 2020**, or the first meeting day thereafter:

Authorize the Controller to transfer from Fund No. 339/70, account number to be determined, to Fund No. 100/70, account number and amount as follows:

Account No. 001092, Sworn Overtime \$ 50,000

- c. Place the following action relative to the 2018-2020 IPE grant on the City Council agenda on **July 1, 2019**, or the first meeting day thereafter:

Authorize the Controller to transfer from Fund No. 339/70, account number to be determined, to Fund No. 100/12, account number and amount as follows:

Account No. 001010, Salaries, General \$ 74,373

- d. Place the following action relative to the 2018-2020 IPE grant on the City Council agenda on **July 1, 2020**, or the first meeting day thereafter:

Authorize the Controller to transfer from Fund No. 339/70, account number to be determined, to Fund No. 100/12, account number and amount as follows:

Account No. 001010, Salaries, General \$ 21,072

Fiscal Impact Statement: The CAO reports that approval of the above recommendations will allow for the expenditure of the FY 2018-2020 IPE Program grant award totaling \$400,000. No matching funds are required for this grant. There is no impact to the General Fund as a result of these actions. These actions are in compliance with the City's Financial Policies in that one-time revenue is used for one-time expenses.


SUMMARY

At its regular meeting held on May 22, 2019, the Public Safety Committee considered CAO and Board of Police Commissioners reports relative to the FY 2018-20120 IPE Grant in the amount of \$400,000, for the period of October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2020, from the DOJ. The LAPD has been an annual recipient of the IPE Program Grant since FY 2009 with the exception of FY 2013 and 2015 when the LAPD did not apply for the grant. Through this grant funding, the LAPD has been able to strengthen its efforts in combating the proliferation of counterfeit goods; enforcing copyright, trademark, and patent laws; and, deterring organized counterfeit manufacturing and distribution rings.

After providing an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to approve the recommendations presented in the CAO report, as detailed above. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
