Paula Boland is a lifelong community leader of the San Fernando Valley. She began her career as a relator and staunch community activist from Granada Hills. Among her many leadership posts, Paula served as the past President of the Granada Hills Chamber of Commerce and was awarded the distinguished Citizen of the Year Award.

She served for three terms as a State Assemblymember from 1990-1996. She proudly represented the 38th District Assembly District which encompassed eastern Ventura County and northwestern Los Angeles County and the city of Los Angeles including the communities of Chatsworth, Granada Hills, and Northridge.
