CATEGORICAL EXEMPTION and TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to establishing an Overnight Parking District (OPD) to prohibit the overnight parking of vehicles along segments of North Citrus and North Mansfield Avenues.

Recommendations for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Ryu – O'Farrell):

- FIND that the proposed action is categorically exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) in accordance with Article III.1.a.3 of the Los Angeles City CEQA Guidelines.
- 2. RESOLVE, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.54 and California Vehicle Code Section 22651(n), to hereby establish an OPD along North Citrus and North Mansfield Avenues between Lexington Avenue and Santa Monica Boulevard.
- 3. AUTHORIZE the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) to:
 - a. Post the TOW AWAY NO STOPPING 2 AM TO 6 AM restriction on the street segments noted above.
 - b. Make any technical adjustments deemed necessary to implement the parking signs authorized by this action.
- DETERMINE that the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) shall have primary responsibility for enforcement of these OPD parking restrictions, with support from LADOT Parking Enforcement.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

On April 3, 2019, Council considered Resolution (Ryu – O'Farrell) relative to establishing an OPD to prohibit the overnight parking of vehicles along segments of North Citrus and North Mansfield Avenues. Resolution states area residents face the problem of criminal activity and health and safety issues related to non-residents and the homeless parking their vehicles overnight in their neighborhood. LAPD has expressed support for establishing an OPD for this neighborhood. Council referred resolution to the Transportation Committee for consideration.

At its meeting held April 10, 2019, the Transportation Committee recommended that Council approve the establishment of the proposed OPD.
