Final Ordinance of Intention No. 186171 Report from Board of Public Works Date 06/16/2019 05/17/2019 An Ordinance pursuant to the provisions of Section 6.95 - 6.127 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code, Section 53753.5 of the California Government Code, and Proposition 218 (Articles XIII C and XIII D of the California Constitution) declaring the intention of the Council of the City of Los Angeles to order the necessary street lighting systems to be operated, maintained and repaired, including furnishing electric energy, for a period of one year ending June 30, 2020, for the lighting of the certain districts designated as the **1996/97 Z-SERIES STREET LIGHTING MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENT DISTRICT** ("MASTER DISTRICT") in the City of Los Angeles. The "MASTER DISTRICT" was created for administrative convenience and is comprised of individual "COMPONENT DISTRICTS" created prior to the effective date of Proposition 218 to fund street lighting related services and/or activities.

The boundaries and the individual assessments for the COMPONENT DISTRICTS have remained the same since their creation. No assessments will increase and no new properties will be added to the COMPONENT DISTRICTS. The city may from time to time delete all or a portion of a COMPONENT DISTRICT from the MASTER DISTRICT but only if such change will not increase any individual COMPONENT DISTRICT assessment amounts beyond the 1996-97 amount. Such COMPONENT DISTRICTS are therefore exempt under section 5 of Proposition 218 from the procedures and approval process set forth in section 4 of Proposition 218.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The public interest and convenience require, and it is the intention of the Council of the City of Los Angeles to order the following improvement to be made, to wit:

That the necessary street lighting systems be operated, maintained and repaired, including the furnishing of electric energy, for the period of one year ending June 30, 2020 for the lighting of:

All those streets, alleys, and other public places within the boundaries of the following districts that have heretofore been assessed for such services for the first time in 1996/97 and for the period ending June 30, 2019. The COMPONENT DISTRICTS to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses of this improvement shall collectively be the "1996/97 Z-SERIES LIGHTING known as STREET MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENT DISTRICT." THE COMPONENT DISTRICTS in the MASTER DISTRICT are described as those lighting districts with assessment diagram numbers 11136, 11138 through 11153, 11162, 11163, 11165 through 11194, 11196 through 11222, 11224 through 11227, 11229 through 11247, and 11256 through 11258, as described more fully in sections 2 and 4 herein. The MASTER DISTRICT includes the following COMPONENT DISTRICTS:

Sec. 2. All of the said work shall be done in accordance with the report, prepared and approved by the Director of the Bureau of Street Lighting adopted by the Board of Public Works therefore, approved by the City Council and on file in the office of the City Clerk. Reference to said report is hereby made for a full and detailed description of the proposed improvements and of the assessments to be levied.

Sec. 3. The said Council hereby makes all the costs and expenses of said improvements, including incidental expenses, chargeable upon the "COMPONENT DISTRICTS" to be benefited thereby, with no additional portion of the costs to be paid out of the City Treasury.

Sec. 4. The Council hereby determines and declares that the COMPONENT DISTRICTS which receive special benefit from said improvements and are to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof, are described by the diagram included by reference in the said report of the Director of the Bureau of Street Lighting adopted by the Board of Public Works, which diagram indicates by a boundary line the extent of the territory included within each COMPONENT DISTRICT. Reference is hereby made to said report and diagram for a full and complete description of each said COMPONENT DISTRICT, which diagram shall govern for all details as to the extent thereof. Diagrams showing the territory of the COMPONENT DISTRICTS are on file in the office of the Bureau of Street Lighting, 1149 S. Broadway, 2nd Floor, Los Angeles, California, 90015. All public streets and alleys or portions thereof are hereby excepted therefrom.

Sec. 5. That the proceedings for the said improvements shall be had and taken under and in accordance with Sections 6.95 - 6.127 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code, Sections 53753.5 of the California Government Code, and Proposition 218 (Articles XIII C and XIII D of the California Constitution).

Sec. 6. The Board of Public Works shall cause notices of said improvements to be published in newspapers of general circulation published and distributed in the several areas of the City in the manner and form and within the time required by law.

Sec. 7. That <u>June 18, 2019</u> at the hour of 10 o'clock a.m. is the time, and the Council Chamber on the third floor in City Hall the City of Los Angeles is the place, when and where a public hearing on the proposed improvements and assessments will be held by the City Council. Any person objecting to their assessment may file a written protest or appeal with the City Clerk at any time prior to the hearing by the City Council. Any person may also present written or oral comments at the City Council meeting on this matter. Such protest must contain a description of the property in which each signer thereof owns an interest, sufficient to identify the property, and be delivered to the City Clerk, and no other protests than those presented within the time specified will be considered.

Sec. 8. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and have it published in accordance with Council policy, either in a daily newspaper circulated in the City of Los Angeles or by posting for ten days in three public places in the City of Los Angeles: one copy on the bulletin board located at the Main Street entrance to the Los Angeles City Hall; one copy on the bulletin board located at the Main Street entrance to the Los Angeles City Hall; and one copy on the bulletin board located at the Temple Street entrance to the Los Angeles County Hall of Records.

ANNUAL ASSESSMENT FOR STREET LIGHTING MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION FOR 2019/20- 1996/97 Z SERIES STREET LIGHTING MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENT DISTRICT (ASSESSMENT DISTRICTS OF 1996/97 ONLY, ASSESSMENTS AND DISTRICT FROZEN SINCE 1996)

As recommended in the accompanying report of the Director of the Office of Petroleum and Natural Gas Administration & Safety, which this Board has adopted, the Board of Public Works recommends that the Mayor

- Council adopt this Report and the Ordinance of Intention (Transmittal No.1), under which individual maintenance assessments, the total amount assessed, and the boundaries of the districts will remain the same as they were in1996/1997, and be exempt from the "procedures and approval process" (section 4 of Proposition 218) as allowed in section 5 of Proposition 218, for 2019/20. No assessments will be increased, and no properties will be added to these districts. Therefore, no ballots will be required; and
- 2. Proceedings for the maintenance of 92 separate street lighting maintenance district for fiscal year 2019-2020 be conducted in conformance with Division 6, Chapter 3, Article 1 of the Administrative Code, California Government Code Sections 53753.5, and Proposition 218 (Articles XIII C and XIII D of the California State Constitution). At the conclusion of the Council Public Hearing, assessments be confirmed and an ordinance levying the assessments be adopted.

There is no impact to the General Fund.
