The Eagle Rock community is experiencing public safety problems associated with large, construction hauling trucks that continually park and idle on city streets. In addition to monopolizing parking spaces, these trucks idle with their engines running for lengthy periods of time. These vehicles constrict travel lanes, block a driver's ability to see, and increase greenhouse gas emissions.

While the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 80.69.1 restricts the parking of large trailers, semitrailers on a highway, street, alley or public way. The City should have a policy that specifically applies to idling trucks.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Council request the City Attorney, working with the Department of Transportation and any other appropriate department, to prepare and present an ordinance to restrict the parking of commercial and/or construction vehicles from parking and idling for extended periods of time.

I FURTHER MOVE that the Department of Transportation install appropriate parking restriction signs for construction vehicles along Colorado Boulevard between North Figueroa Street and the eastern City boundary.
