At this time, we would like to take the opportunity to express our appreciation for the critical initiatives that were funded in the Mayor's Proposed Budget. More specifically, additional funding for sworn overtime to be used to address emerging crime issues throughout the City, dedicated overtime funding to support the critical work of the A Bridge Home initiatives, funding to support the Department's recruitment efforts to hire more women and African American Police Officers, funding to open the Harbor Jail which will help us better serve the community in the Harbor-Gateway portion of the City, and finally your on-going support for continued civilian hiring in those critical areas that will enable us to return officers to patrol more quickly.
