## SUMMARY

On November 21, 2019, the Board of Airport Commissioners approved the LAWA Letter of Agreement with the City of Inglewood for the release of \$9,275,000 for the Residential Sound Insulation - Grant Implementation Plan 15. The City of Inglewood established its Noise Compatibility Program in 1984, starting with property acquisition, and then adding residential sound insulation into their program in 1991. Inglewood's Residential Sound Insulation Program is funded by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and LAWA.

LAWA provides at least a 20 percent match for the FAA AIP grants received by the local jurisdictions. Since its inception, the Inglewood Residential Sound Insulation Program has received \$209.6 million from the FAA and \$130.1 million from LAWA for a total of \$339.7 million. So far, the Inglewood Residential Sound Insulation Program has mitigated 7,739 dwelling units or 69 percent of its 11,156 eligible units. This action would add 1,026 units.

At its special meeting held December 3, 2019, the Trade, Travel, and Tourism Committee discussed this matter with representatives of LAWA. LAWA staff advised the Committee that no program is currently in place for residents of Westchester. LAWA will continue reaching out to the FAA to seek additional funds for the community. Committee recommended that Council approve LAWA's Letter of Agreement with the City Inglewood, as recommended by the Board of Airport
