Using relief funds to protect residents will stabilize vital public assets: affordable housing for the most vulnerable in our society. According to CARES Act Flexibilities for CDBF Funds repot issued on April 9, 2020, grantees can use CDBG to cover or reimburse costs in response to Coronavirus. Without support for affordable housing developments, nonprofit housers like Abode Communities will have to cover lost rent revenue on our own. We may have to turn to operating reserves, which are limited and not meant to cover long-term operational shortfalls. This financial stress could destabilize not just individual affordable properties, but the larger nonprofit entity of Abode Communities as well. This would put many more low income households at risk of losing their home. These funds need to help people affected by Coronavirus. If a resident has been infected or marked in another way by the virus (eg job loss), using CDBG money as rent loss replacement for 90 day swill project residents. It will also stabilize the affordable housing developments, which are valuable public assets, especially during this time of economic crisis. Details of the proposal are as follows. How Payments Work: Payments would go directly from the City of LA to the nonprofit housing operator such as Abode Communities in the form of a grant. Units Eligible for Aid: This relief funding would apply to restricted affordable units without some other from of rental subsidy such as Section 8, and that are occupied by residents experiencing hardship from coronavirus. Length of Payments: Rental payments would be for up to 90 days. No Repayment from Residents do NOT need to repay the forgiven rent for this period.
