TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to establishing oversize vehicle parking restrictions along several street segments in Council District 11.

Recommendations for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Bonin – Blumenfield):

- 1. RESOLVE, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.69.4 and California Vehicle Code Section 22507, to hereby prohibit the parking of vehicles that are in excess of 22 feet in length or over seven feet in height, during the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., along Northstar Avenue between Speedway and Ocean Front Walk, Louise Avenue between Stewart and Chase Avenues, Walsh Avenue between Mascagni Street and Westlawn Avenue, Washington Place between Berryman and Minerva Avenues, Venice Boulevard between Centinela and Ocean View Avenues, Centinela Avenue between Venice Boulevard and McCune Avenue, Saint Susan Place between Palms Boulevard and the cul-de-sac, South Carmelina Avenue between Exposition and Pico Boulevards, and Nebraska Avenue between South Barrington and Barry Avenues.
- 2. DIRECT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT), upon approval of this action, to post signs giving notice of a Tow Away, No Parking restriction for oversize vehicles within the specific hours detailed.
- 3. AUTHORIZE the LADOT to make any technical corrections or clarifications to the above instructions in order to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

## SUMMARY

On January 21, 2020, Council considered Resolution (Bonin – Blumenfield) relative to establishing oversize vehicle parking restrictions along several street segments in Council District 11. Resolution states there is an increased problem with oversized vehicles parking on the residential street segments listed above, often immediately adjacent to residential buildings. These large vehicles are often parked overnight, constricting travel lanes and creating undesirable roadway conditions. Council referred Resolution to the Transportation Committee for consideration.

At its meeting held February 12, 2020, the Transportation Committee recommended that Council approve the proposed parking restrictions and related LADOT instructions pursuant to Resolution.
