The Bridge Housing program has only produced 13 centers, which offers 973 beds and does not come close to providing shelter and resources for the 60,000 homeless people. The most obvious discrepancy is the budget directed toward LAPD that is the only department allocated a budget of over \$1 billion. It appears the education bonuses LAPD officers will receive of \$190-\$290 every two weeks for having a degree are grossly out of touch with the needs of the City of Los Angeles, and the anti-racist work needed in that department.

Comments for Public Posting: We are in the midst of a health pandemic with severe economic consequences. Over 50% of Angelenos are unemployed — and we can expect 42% lasting unemployment. Over 50% of this city is renters — and if the people are unemployed, they cannot pay rent. Prior to the pandemic, there were around 60k unhoused folx; after evictions and economic insecurity due to COVID-19 and its fall out, we can expect thousands more. In this context, the Mayor is proposing an increase to LAPD, despite the fact that crime has fallen considerably during the past few months. LAPD has seen a rise in overtime which, more often than not, is paid out to officers harassing unhoused people as well as Black, Indigenous, people of color. After declining to vote on this proposal, City Council referred it back to the Budget and Finance Committee. Now, the Committee has decided not to meet, thereby shirking its duty and upholding the racist and white-supremacist structures that underlie both the proposal and City Council as a governing body. I am urging you to publicly support the People's Budget. The Mayor's disastrous proposal MUST be updated with the priorities of Angelenos. You need to Adopt a People's Budget which defunds the police. We need disinvestment from the police, and investment in community- and health-centered services. The LAPD do not need 53% of the city's funding. The city council needs to hold an emergency meeting on June 1st 2020 and REJECT the Mayor's proposal. The council needs to do what's right for the people. Your constituents are watching. The mayor does not elect you into office; we the people of Los Angeles do. Please, make the right choice. Do not approve the Mayor's funding.
