**Comments for Public Posting:** I am writing in favor of Councilperson Herb Wesson's motion to develop an unarmed model of crisis response that would divert non-violent calls for service away from LAPD to the appropriate non-law enforcement agency. This is in line with the overall recommendations of more than twenty thousand people who were surveyed for the People's Budget. It is overwhelmingly clear that we need to divest from the LAPD in order to invest in communities of color. These communities need more school counsellors and librarians and more greenspace and public transportation. A very first step though would be the realization that the person responding to an incident involving an intoxicated person asleep in a car at a Wendy's should not have a gun, and should have training as a social worker, or a pyschiatric social, or an interventionist of some other kind. Our community's safety is not dependent on more guns and more police. It is dependent on the strength of our mutuality, our ability to reinforce each other's humanity. When there is a tear in this fabric, the solution is to turn to those who can repair the tear and not shoot a larger whole in the fabric.
