To help reduce parking congestion, illegal dumping and blight in the community of Wilmington by discouraging the storage of recreational and commercial vehicles on our streets the Wilmington Neighborhood Council (WNC) passed the following motion on September 24, 2008:

The Wilmington Neighborhood Council requests the Council office to install signage prohibiting the parking of oversize vehicles between the hours of 2AM and 6AM on all residential streets and thoroughfares in the community of Wilmington in accordance with Section 1. Division N, Chapter VIII of the Los Angeles Municipal Code, Sec. 80.69.4., Parking of Oversize Vehicles.

Our board feels that posting prohibitive signage on all residential streets and main thoroughfares is necessary to prevent the problem from simply moving from one street to another.
