

Your **PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE**

reports as follows:

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to a grant award for the 2009 Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force Recovery Act Program.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

1. AUTHORIZE the Chief of Police, or designee, to:
 - a. Retroactively submit and accept the 2009 Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force Recovery Act Program grant in the amount of \$375,000 for the period October 1, 2009, through September 30, 2012, from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance.
 - b. Negotiate and execute the grant award agreement on behalf of the City and submit all necessary documents relative to the grant award, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form and legality.
 - c. Negotiate and execute a Professional Services Agreement on behalf of the City, with Coalition to Abolish Slavery and Trafficking (CAST) to provide comprehensive human trafficking victim services, for the period October 1, 2009, through September 30, 2012, for a sum not to exceed \$120,000, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form and legality.
2. AUTHORIZE the Police Department to:
 - a. Spend up to the grant amount of \$375,000 in accordance with the grant agreement.
 - b. Submit grant reimbursement requests to the grantor and deposit grant receipts in Fund 339, Department 70, account number to be determined.
3. AUTHORIZE the Controller to:
 - a. Establish a grant receivable in Fund 339 in the amount of \$375,000 and establish an appropriation account, account number to be determined, titled "ARRA 2009 Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force Recovery Act Program" within Fund 339, Department No. 70.
 - b. Increase appropriations, as needed, from Fund No. 339/70, ARRA 2009 Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force Recovery Act Program, account number to be determined, to Fund No. 100/70 in the accounts and amounts as follows:

4. AUTHORIZE the Police Department to prepare Controller's instructions for any technical adjustments consistent with this action, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer (CAO); and, REQUEST that the Controller implement the instructions.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The CAO reports that this action will not impact the General Fund. Acceptance of this grant will reimburse the City for 70 percent of the cost of a Management Analyst staff position. The remaining 30 percent will be paid by existing budgeted resources within the Police Department.

Community Impact Statement Submitted: None

SUMMARY

In a report to the Mayor and Council dated April 23, 2010 (attached to the Council file), the CAO states that the Police Department requests authority to accept the 2009 Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force Recovery Act Program grant in the amount of \$375,000. The CAO reports that this grant will reimburse the City for 70 percent of the cost of one Management Analyst currently employed and funded by the Department, in addition to other expenses relating to the Human Trafficking Task Force.


The CAO goes on to report that the Los Angeles Metropolitan Task Force on Human Trafficking is a collaborative task force led by the Police Department which brings together various federal and state agencies, and a number of victim and social service organizations with the goal of identifying victims and convicting persons engaged in severe forms of human trafficking. In accordance with the grant agreement, the Police Department will sub-award \$120,000 to CAST, a service organization dedicated to providing human trafficking victims comprehensive long-term services which include social and legal services, outreach, and training.

On March 2, 2010, the Board of Police Commissioners approved the Police Department's request to accept the grant award. The CAO concurs with the action taken by the Board.

At its meeting held April 26, 2010, the Public Safety Committee recommended that Council approve the CAO's recommendations relative to the 2009 Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force Recovery Act Program grant award, as recommended by the Board of Police Commissioners.
