CATEGORICAL EXEMPTION, TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT, and RESOLUTION relative to the renewal of Temporary Preferential Parking District (PPD) No. 162.

Recommendations for Council action:

1. FIND that the renewal of Temporary PPD No. 162, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 80.58.d, is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act as a Class 1 Categorical Exemption, under Article III, 1.a.3 of the City's environmental guidelines.
2. FIND that the parking problems that led to the establishment of Temporary PPD No. 162, consisting of the 100 and 200 blocks of Gower Street between Beverly Boulevard and First Street, Lucerne Boulevard between Beverly Boulevard and First Street, and First Street between Gower Street and Lucerne Boulevard, still exist and that no permanent solutions are available to be implemented at this time.
3. ADOPT accompanying RESOLUTION renewing Temporary PPD No. 162, for 12 months, until April 28, 2012, pursuant to LAMC Section 80.58.d.

Fiscal Impact Statement: DOT reports that revenue from the sale of permits will cover the cost of implementing, administering, and enforcing temporary PPD No. 162. Furthermore, the City may gain additional General Fund revenue from the issuance of parking citations to violators of the district's parking restrictions.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

In a report to Council dated April 4, 2011 (attached to the Council file), DOT recommends that Council renew Temporary PPD No. 162 located in Larchmont Village. The PPD was established by Council action on April 28, 2010. Support for the renewal of the PPD has been given by the Council Office. A map of the PPD is attached to the DOT report.

At its meeting held April 13, 2011, the Transportation Committee recommended that Council renew Temporary PPD No. 162, as recommended by DOT.

RENEWAL OF TEMPORARY PREFERENTIAL PARKING DISTRICT (NO. 162) FOR 12 MORE MONTHS

WHEREAS, on April 28, 2010, the Council adopted a Resolution establishing Temporary Preferential Parking District (PPD) No. 162; which is now due to expire on April 28, 2011; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember La Bonge believes that the conditions that originally justified this Temporary PPD; which include the daily and nightly intrusion of non-resident vehicles associated with employees and customers of Larchmont Village shopping district that park in the neighborhood throughout the day and night, still exist and no other viable measure to resolve the resulting parking intrusion into the neighborhood is available; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember La Bonge has requested the renewal of Temporary PPD No. 162, for another 12 months to provide continued relief to the residents of the District from the adverse parking impact they were experiencing prior to the establishment of the District; and

WHEREAS, Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.58.d authorizes Temporary PPDs to be renewed on an annual basis by resolution until either a permanent solution is found or the problem ceases to exist.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.58.d, hereby renews Temporary PPD No.162 for an additional 12 months until April 28, 2012; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all other terms and conditions of Temporary PPD No. 162 remain unchanged.

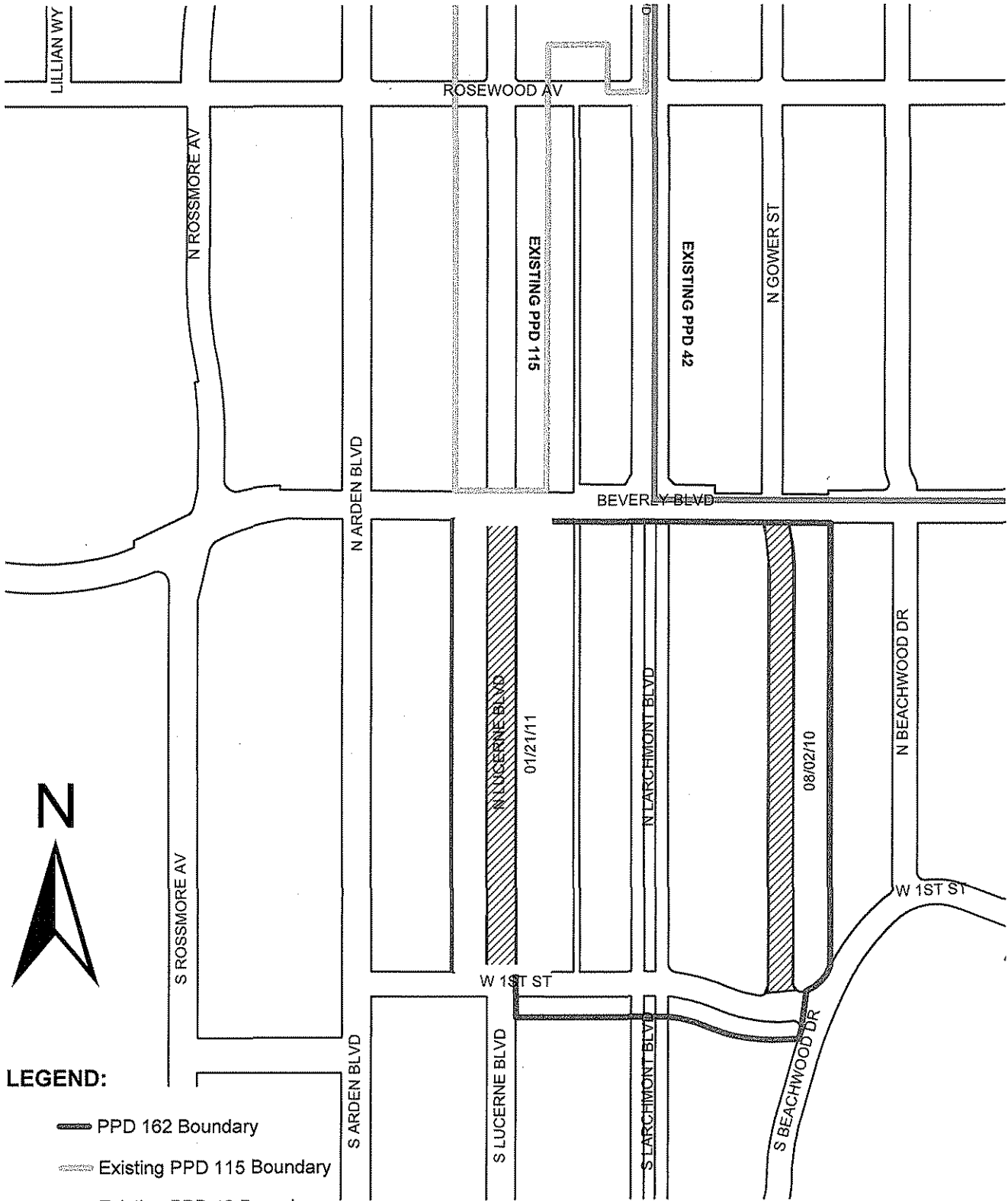
