

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to retroactive approval to apply for and accept a \$393,799 grant award from the Los Angeles County Probation Department (LACPD) for the 2015-16 Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act (JJCPA) program for the period of July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

1. AUTHORIZE the Chief, Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), or designee, to:
  - a. Accept the 2015-16 JJCPA grant award of \$393,799 from the LACPD for the period of July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.
  - b. Negotiate and execute the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), attached to the Council file, for Fiscal Year 2015-16 between the City and the LACPD for the period of July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016 for a total of \$393,799, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form and legality.
  
2. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to:
  - a. Spend up to the total grant amount of \$393,799 in accordance with the MOA.
  - b. Submit grant reimbursement requests to the grantor and deposit the grant receipts in the Police Department Grants Fund No. 339/70.
  
3. AUTHORIZE the Controller to:
  - a. Establish a grant receivable in the amount of \$393,799 and establish an appropriation account, account number to be determined, within Fund No, 339/70 for the receipt and disbursement of 2015-16 JJCPA grant funds.
  - b. Increase appropriations on an as-needed basis as follows:

4. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to prepare Controller instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer (CAO); and, AUTHORIZE the Controller to implement the instructions.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The CAO reports that approval of the recommendations will provide \$393,799 in funding to the LAPD for juvenile delinquency prevention and intervention programs on an overtime basis as part of the JJCPA grant program. No matching funds are required and there is no impact to the General Fund. Acceptance of the grant and approval of the

recommendations is in compliance with the City's Financial Policies in that one-time funding is used for one-time expenses.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At the meeting held on September 1, 2015, your Public Safety Committee considered Board of Police Commissioners and CAO reports relative to retroactive approval to apply for and accept a \$393,799 grant award from the LACPD for the 2015-16 JJCPA program for the period of July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016. The CAO reports that the JJCPA grant is a state grant administered by the LACPD to provide prevention and intervention programs for at-risk youth and their families who reside in recipient jurisdictional boundaries and attend school in identified School District Service Areas. The grant, which has been awarded annually to the City since 2001, assists the LAPD in implementation of its High Risk/High Need and Safe Passages/Safe Zones programs that focus on curtailing juvenile delinquency through prevention and intervention services. The Safe Passages/Safe Zones program aims to allow students and their families to safely engage in daily activities including attending school and obtaining community services in or in close proximity to schools, parks and housing projects that are designated JJCPA sites. The High Risk/High Need program provides increased supervision to youth who are transitioning from probation camps to the community. LAPD responsibilities as part of these programs include enhanced patrol services, probation check-ins to offer assistance and community partner service referrals, monitoring gang activity and violations, and conducting truancy and curfew sweeps in coordination with the LACPD. Some of these activities include the involvement of youths from the LAPD Cadet Program, who work with officers in JJCPA sites and other youth to benefit the communities they live in.

After an opportunity for public comment was held, the Committee moved to approve the recommendations presented in the CAO transmittal, as detailed above. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
