RESOLVE to include in the City's 2013-14 Federal Legislative Program OPPOSITION to H.R. 710 (Farr) which would amend Title 18 of the United States Code, to provide an affirmative defense for the medical use of marijuana in accordance with the laws of various states, and for other purposes.

Summary:

At its regular meeting of August 16, 2013, the Rules, Elections and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered a Resolution and Chief Legislative Analyst report relative to establishing the City's position to oppose H.R. 710 (Farr) which would amend Title 18 of the United States Code, to provide an affirmative defense for the medical use of marijuana in accordance with the laws of various states, and for other purposes.
