RULES, ELECTIONS AND INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to the City's position to support AB 156, which would expand provisions authorizing the interception of wire or electronic communications.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Parks - Perry), SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2013-14 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for AB 156 (Holden), which would expand the provisions under state law authorizing the interception of wire or electronic communications, to apply if a judge determines that there is probable cause that a suspect is involved in human trafficking.

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA). The City Administrative Officer has not completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

At its special meeting of January 10, 2014, the Rules, Elections and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered a CLA report and Resolution (Parks - Perry) relative to the City's position to support AB 156, which would expand provisions authorizing the interception of wire or electronic communications. The CLA report, attached to the Council file, provides additional background information.

After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended that Council adopt the accompanying Resolution. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
