reports as follows:

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND GENERAL SERVICES COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to authorization to destroy certain obsolete records from the Los Angeles Police Commission for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), Valley Traffic Division, for the period of January 1, 1987 through December 31, 2007.

Recommendation for Council action:

ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to authorize the destruction of certain obsolete records from the LAPD, Valley Traffic Division, for the period of January 1, 1987 through December 31, 2007.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The City Clerk reports that the retention of 12 records boxes beyond the required retention time period, based on industry commercial standard rates, will continue to cost the City the equivalent of a minimum of \$1.94 per month, or \$23.33 per year.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

The City Clerk certifies that the request for authority to destroy obsolete records is complete, accurate, and adequate. Also, City Clerk staff reviewed the request for historical content and removed any items of unique historical value. In a communication dated January 15, 2013, the City Attorney states that it finds that the request for destruction of obsolete records has been processed in accordance with the requirements of Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 12.5 and approves the destruction thereof. At a meeting held on February 12, 2013, your Committee recommended that Council adopt the Resolution to authorize the destruction of said records. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
