

Subject: **RENEWAL OF TEMPORARY PREFERENTIAL PARKING DISTRICT
NO. 150 IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 11 AND AMENDMENT OF
BOUNDARIES**

SUMMARY

The Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) recommends renewal of Temporary Preferential Parking District (TPPD) No. 150 (C.F. 09-2273) and modification of boundary to include the 700 block of Radcliffe Avenue.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. FIND that the parking problems that led to the establishment and renewals of TPPD No. 150 still exist and have expanded to the 700 block of Radcliffe Avenue, and that no permanent solution has been found.
 2. FIND that the expansion and renewal of TPPD No 150 is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as a Class 1 Categorical Exemption under Article III, 1, a, 3 of the 2002 Los Angeles City CEQA Guidelines.
 3. ADOPT the Resolution amending the boundaries of the district to include the 700 block of Radcliffe Avenue and renewing TPPD No. 150 for 12 more months, until September 30, 2015, pursuant to Section 80.58.d of the L.A.M.C. at which time it will again be subject to the administrative renewal process.
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DISCUSSION

The City Council adopted a Resolution (C.F. 09-223) establishing TPPD No. 150 on September 30, 2009. Since the administrative renewal on September 30, 2012, the residents on the 700 block of Radcliffe Avenue have requested and petitioned to be included in the TPPD because of the substantial negative impact from non-residents parking in the area. The Councilmember has requested the boundaries of the district be amended to include the 700 block of Radcliffe Avenue.

TPPD No. 150 will renew administratively September 30, 2015 unless LADOT receives a written request from the Councilmember for its amendment or termination.

BACKGROUND

Councilmember Bonin sent a letter to LADOT (copy attached) stating that the parking problems that led to the establishment of TPPD No. 150 still exist and have expanded to the 700 block of Radcliffe Avenue and that there seemed to be no other solution to this problem other than amendment of the boundaries to include Radcliffe Avenue between renewal of the district and the addition of an additional authorized restriction to address the parking intrusion the residents continue to experience and to renew TPPD No. 150.

The City Council has the authority, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.58.d, to establish or renew TPPDs by resolution "to provide relief for residents who suffer an excessive parking impact ... as the result of any conditions which impact fewer than six blocks and which, in the judgment of the Council member of the District and after consultation with the Parking Administrator, deserve immediate relief until a permanent solution can be found". Temporary Preferential Parking Districts are limited in duration to a maximum of 12 months from the date of approval of the resolution. Temporary districts may be renewed on an annual basis by resolution until either a permanent solution is found or the problem ceases to exist.

The proposed amendment of the boundaries and renewal of this TPPD will not change the street use and is therefore subject to a Class 1 Categorical Exemption.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

The cost of implementing, administering and enforcing Temporary Preferential Parking District No. 150 will be covered by the revenue from the sale of permits for the District. Furthermore, the City may gain additional General Fund revenue from the issuance of parking citations to violators of the District's parking restrictions.

COORDINATION

Councilmember Bonin has requested the amendment of the boundaries and renewal of TPPD No.150 to provide continued relief to the residents of the District from the adverse parking impact they were experiencing prior to the establishment of this District and has further requested that an alternative parking restriction be made available for use of the residents to provide the best relief to those residents.

RESOLUTION

RENEWAL OF TEMPORARY PREFERENTIAL PARKING DISTRICT NO. 150 IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 11 AND AMENDMENT OF BOUNDARIES

WHEREAS, on September 30, 2009, the Council adopted a Resolution (C.F. 09-2273) establishing Temporary Preferential Parking District (PPD) No. 150; and is now currently due to expire on September 30, 2014; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Bonin has determined that the conditions that originally justified this Temporary PPD; which includes intrusion of non-resident vehicles associated with the Pacific Palisades business district along Sunset Boulevard and from Palisades Charter High School, still exist and has expanded to the 700 block of Radcliffe Avenue, and no other viable measure to resolve the resulting parking shortage in the neighborhood is available; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Bonin has requested that the boundaries of this District be amended to include the 700 block of Radcliffe Avenue and that Temporary PPD No. 150 be renewed for 12 more months to provide continued relief to the residents of the District from the adverse parking impact they were experiencing prior to the establishment of the District; and

WHEREAS, Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.58.d authorizes Temporary PPDs to be renewed on an annual basis by resolution until either a permanent solution is found or the problem ceases to exist.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.58.d hereby amends the boundaries of the TPPD to include the 700 block of Radcliffe Avenue and renews Temporary PPD No. 150 for an additional 12 months until September 30, 2015 at which time it will be subject to administrative renewal; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all other terms and conditions of Temporary PPD No. 150 remain unchanged.


PREFERENTIAL PARKING DISTRICT NO. 150

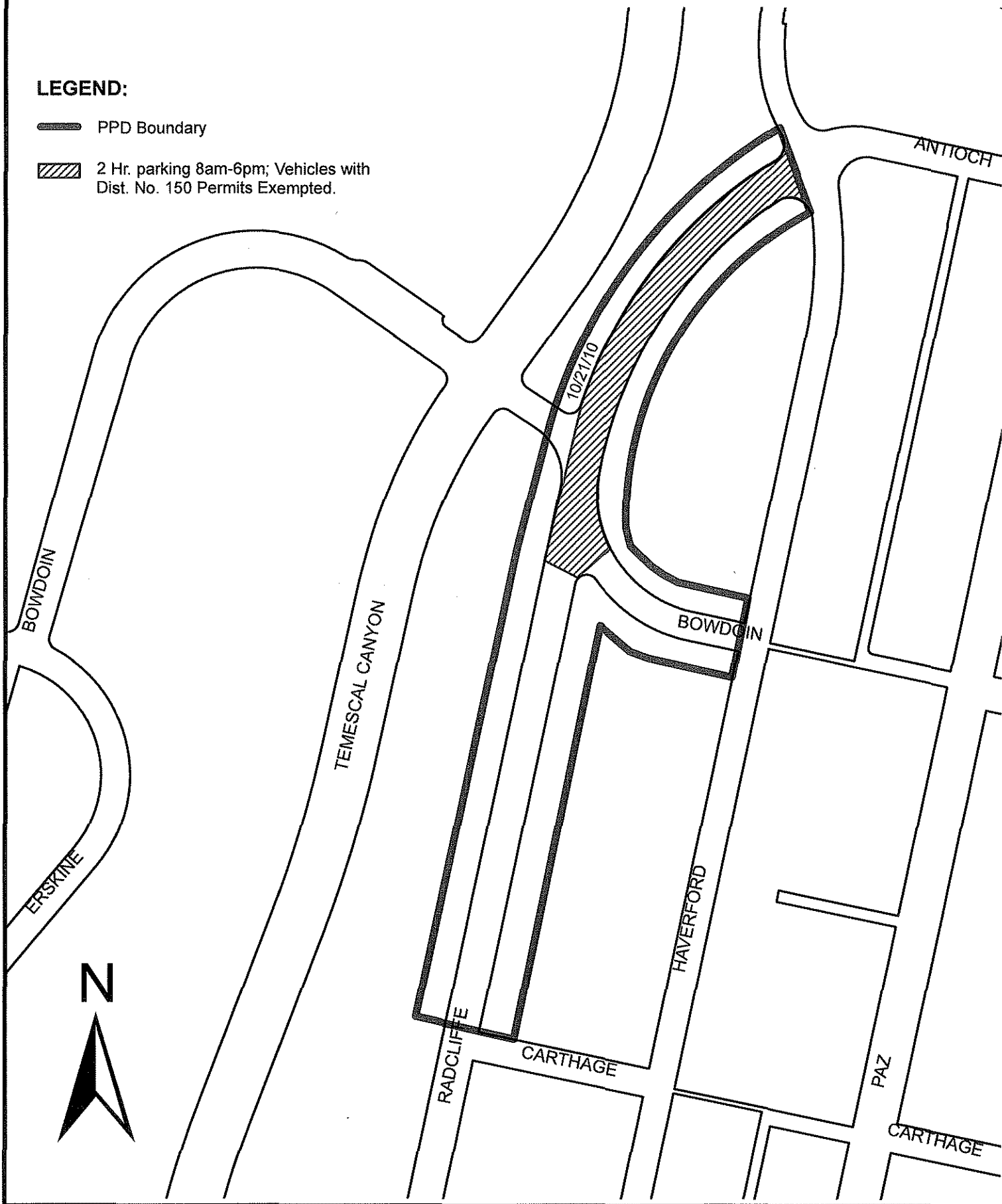
COUNCIL DISTRICT 11

RE: REQUEST FOR RENEWAL OF TEMPORARY PREFERENTIAL PARKING DISTRICT
No. 150 WITH AMENDMENT OF BOUNDARIES

Dear Mr. de la Vega:

On September 30, 2009, the City Council adopted the Resolution establishing Temporary Preferential Parking District No. 150 for the residents of Radcliffe Avenue between Haverford Avenue and Bowdoin Street and Bowdoin Street between Radcliffe Avenue and Haverford Avenue in order to address parking issues that exist due to their proximity to Palisades Charter High School, businesses and other institutions on Haverford Avenue and Antioch Street. Without the Temporary Preferential Parking District, the situation resulted in an excessive parking impact upon the residents of these streets from which immediate relief was sought.

The conditions still exist in this neighborhood and have expanded to create an excessive parking impact on Radcliffe Avenue between Bowdoin Street and Carthage Street. At this time, there does not seem to be any other permanent solution to this problem other than to amend the boundaries to include the 700 block of Radcliffe Avenue in Temporary Preferential Parking District No. 150 and to renew this District to afford all residents the protections of the permit parking district.

Since the Temporary Parking District expires on September 30, 2013 and since the problems that justified the establishment of the district still exist, I request that the Department of Transportation proceed with the process to renew this Temporary Preferential Parking District for an additional 12 months at which time it should be administratively renewed unless my office requests further changes.
